GAME PREVIEW

• Having already locked up at minimum a share of the Patriot League regular season title, the Midshipmen are looking to extend their 13-game winning streak over Army (7-3, 3-1 Patriot League) on Saturday when sixth-ranked Navy (9-2, 5-0 Patriot League) travels to West Point for the annual Star Game ... faceoff is slated for 12:00 pm at Michie Stadium.

• Saturday's contest will be televised live on ESPNU with Vice President, Corporate Projects at ESPN Rob Simmelkjaer (play by play) and former Army lacrosse coach Jack Emmer (analyst) calling the action.

• The Voice of Navy Lacrosse Pete Medhurst will make the call live on 1430 WNAV, as well as 1050 WFED.

• Additionally, fans can log onto www.goARMYsports.com where a pay-per-view video feed is available ... a live stats link will also be provided on the schedule page via Army's web site.

• Navy's defense held No. 3 Maryland scoreless for 41 minutes, while sophomore attack Tim Paul scored a pair of goals, including the game-winner to lead the Mids to a 5-4 upset victory over the Terps ... it was Navy's fifth game of the season decided by one goal.

• Army had its five-game winning streak snapped last Friday by Patriot League foe Bucknell ... the Bison jumped out to a 6-0 halftime lead and never looked back as it claimed a 7-4 win over the Black Knights ... it was Army's first Patriot League loss of the season.

NAVY VS. ARMY — THE SERIES

• Saturday's contest marks the 86th edition of Army vs. Navy on the lacrosse field and the 76th consecutive year the two programs have battled one another ... it's the longest continuous lacrosse series between Navy and another team.

• Navy owns a commanding 55-26-3 series advantage, winning 13-straight contests, including 10 Star Games.

• The last time Army defeated Navy was on April 25, 1997, when the Black Knights edged the Mids, 14-12, in Annapolis.

• Navy has scored eight or more goals in 18-straight games against Army ... in 15 of those contests, the Mids have reached double digits ... during the Mids' current 13-game run, Navy has been held to single digits just twice.

• The Midshipmen own a 27-13-2 advantage over Army in games played at West Point, including wins in each of the last five meetings.

• Since joining the Patriot League in 2004, Navy has faced Army twice in a season three times ... there have been only five times in the 86-game history (dating back to 1924) that the two programs have battled twice in one season (1978 and 1981 in the NCAA Tournament, 2005, 2006 and 2007 in the Patriot League Tournament).

CONNECTIONS

• Navy head coach Richie Meade has a rare connection with Army ... Prior to becoming Navy's head coach in 1995, Richie Meade spent four seasons as an assistant coach under the legendary Jack Emmer at Army from 1991-94 ... during those four seasons, Army and Navy split with two wins apiece ... as Navy's head coach, Meade owns a 14-2 record against the Black Knights, winning 11 Star Games.

TAKING THE FIELD IN ...

10 • The Mids are just a win away from turning in a program-record fifth-straight 10-win campaign under head coach Richie Meade.

9 • Navy has held the lead at halftime in 10 of its 11 games this season.

8 • The Midshipmen have scored eight or more goals in 18 consecutive games against Army.

7 • Nick Mirabito (18-19) is one of only seven players in the country who have amassed 18 goals and 18 assists this season.

6 • Nick Mirabito has scored at least one goal in all six contests against Army, five of the six he has turned in multiple goals ... has scored 13 goals in six games.

5 • Navy has held its opponent to five or fewer goals in eight of its 11 games, including each of its five Patriot League contests.

4 • Navy is 4-0 in road games this season.

3 • A win over Army would mark the third time in its five years (2004 (7-0), '07) as a member of the Patriot League that it will have turned in an undefeated record in conference action.

2 • Navy's two losses this season have been overtime decisions to sixth-ranked Cornell and fourth-ranked Georgetown.

1 • Navy is No. 1 in the country in wins over the last five years with 58 ... Duke is second with 56 wins.

THE ARMY-NAVY RIVALRY

Not just a rivalry played on the gridiron, the Army-Navy lacrosse tradition dates back more than 80 years, when the Academies played the inaugural game on May 31, 1924, with the Mids prevailing, 5-0, at West Point.

Army and Navy battled each other from there out on a yearly basis until 1929 when the series was sidelined for four years. The series resumed in 1933 with an 8-5 Army victory and has not been interrupted since.

In 2004, Navy joined the Patriot League for lacrosse. With the new conference affiliation, it guaranteed the two service academies would meet at least once a year, and possibly a second time in the Patriot League Tournament.

There have been only four years in which the two programs have met twice in a season, including each of the last two seasons. In 1978, the Mids earned a 16-13 regular-season victory over the Black Knights in Annapolis. Nearly three weeks later, the fourth-ranked Midshipmen defeated No. 5 Army, 16-15, at home in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament.

In 1981, 12th-ranked Army upset the No. 6 Mids on their home field, claiming a 9-8 victory. Navy, however, picked off No. 3 Army at West Point, 16-10, in the first round of the NCAA Tournament a month later.

The two programs played one another twice in 2005, '06 and '07, as Army and Navy met during the regular season, as well as the championship game of the Patriot League Tournament. Navy earned wins in all six games, including the April 16, 2005, matchup in which an Army-Navy record crowd of 12,117 piled into Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium and cheered the Mids to a 12-9 victory.


The Midshipmen lead the overall series, 56-26-3, dominating the series as of late by winning 13 in a row. It is the longest winning streak by either team in the series.

Additionally, Navy owns a 51-26-3 advantage in Star Games, including 10-straight wins. The Mids have won 13 of the last 15 Star Games.

The largest margin of victory by either team has been an 11-point spread that has occurred on five different occasions. The most recent 11-goal win was by Navy in last year's Patriot League Tournament semifinal matchup in Annapolis where the Mids handed the Black Knights a 12-1 loss.

LAST TIME ... REGULAR SEASON

- Seniors **Tommy Wallin**, **Ian Dingman** and **Billy Looney** scored goals in the final nine minutes to lead No. 8 Navy to a 12-9 victory over arch rival Army in front of 11,370 fans at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.
- Seven different players scored goals, while another two chipped in assists as Navy concluded the Patriot League portion of its schedule undefeated.
- It looked as though it would be a blowout early on as the Mids opened up a 3-0 lead seven minutes into the game.
- Army briefly stopped Navy's momentum at the 6:20 mark when sophomore Brooks Korvin fired off a shot from seven yards out.
- Navy took a 6-2 lead when Wallin found midfielder **William Wallace** cutting to the middle with just 32 seconds remaining in the half.
- On the ensuing face-off, the Mids failed to get a specialist out in a reasonable amount of time and Army was awarded possession.
- The Black Knights wasted little time in setting up, as rookie Brandon Butler found Jason Peyer who tucked in his first-collegiate goal against the Mids with just five ticks left in the opening half.
- Navy scored back-to-back goals just 29 seconds apart in the first three minutes of the second half to open up a five-goal lead, its largest of the game.

- Army, though, went on a five-goal run to knot the score at the end of the third quarter.
- After a goal by Justin Bokmeyer at the 12:17 mark, the Black Knights scored three-straight goals in unique fashion.
- Wigdzinski fired off a shot that was initially saved by Navy keeper **Colin Finnegan**, but the ball popped up and Finnegan lost site of it as it fell to the ground and literally rolled across the line.
- Five minutes later, Ryan Chase sent a shot that again was initially saved by Finnegan, but Peyer snatched it out of the air and poked it in the open net.
- At the 3:43 mark, Korvin got off a slow bouncing shot as he was falling to the ground that somehow found its way into the goal.
- Army knotted the game at eight-all when second-year mid-die Alex Rhoads punched in a shot from 10 yards out.
- Navy regained the lead, when **Mikelis Visgauss** won the draw to start the fourth and fed senior **Victor Barger** who raced to the left side of the field and found a gap.
- Army tied the game at 9-9 (10:43) when Bokmeyer threaded a pass from the left side of the field that went right through a pack of players and LoRusso dunked it in as he sat on the crease.
- Wallin gave the Mids the lead for good with 8:31 to go as he fought off a triple-team that sent him to the ground as he release a shot from five yards out.

LAST TIME ... PATRIOT LEAGUE TOURNAMENT

- Tenth-ranked Navy dominated Army from the opening face-off, as the Midshipmen defeated the fourth-seeded Black Knights, 12-1, in the first of two Patriot League Tournament semifinal games in Annapolis.
- The 11-goal victory ties the series record for largest margin of victory which it has accomplished five times in the 85-game history.
- The one-goal output by Army marks the fewest goals it has scored against Navy since 1989 when the Mids defeated the Black Knights, 12-1.
- Eight different players put goals on the scoreboard for the Mids, including four who each tucked in a pair.
- Seniors **Tommy Wallin** and **Billy Looney**, along with **Tim Paul** and **Nick Mirabito** each scored two goals and added an assist, while senior **Ian Dingman** punched in a goal and dealt out a pair of assists.
- Navy scored just 45 seconds into the contest as Wallin fed Paul as he was cutting to the middle of the field, just two yards outside of the crease.
- Wallin poked in his first goal of the game at the 8:41 mark, triggering five goals over the next five minutes by five different players.

- One of the highlights of the opening quarter was when Dingman fed All-Patriot League long stick midfielder **Victor Barger** for his fourth goal this spring off four shots ... after a lengthy scrum ensued off a face-off, Navy picked up the loose ball with Dingman finding Barger on the doorstep.
- Mirabito scored the last goal of the first quarter and the first marker in the second quarter to push Navy's lead to 7-0 with just over seven minutes to play in the opening half.
- Paul fed Mirabito at the top of the crease when Mirabito was met by an Army defender who sent him airborne. Mirabito, though, stuck the goal.
- Army finally got on the scoreboard with 6:19 to go in the second quarter when middle Kevin LoRusso rippled the back of the net off a shot from nearly 10 yards out.
- Navy then scored back-to-back goals by Looney and Paul to head into the locker room with a 9-1 advantage.
- The Mids went on to score three in the final quarter, including the first-collegiate goal by sophomore **Sean Standen**.
- Navy's defense, led by All-Patriot League players **Jordan DiNola**, **Andrew Dow** and **Brendan Teague**, held Army scoreless in the second half.
- The Mids more than doubled-up Army's shot production as they scored 12 goals on 33 shots against Patriot League Goalkeeper of the Year Adam Fullerton, while the Black Knights put up just one goal on 14 shots.

UPON FURTHER REVIEW

- The following are a few highlights/notes from last Friday's Navy-Maryland game.
- The 5-4 decision secured Navy's first win over an opponent ranked among the top three since beating the top-ranked Terps in 2004, 9-6.
- The 5-4 Navy win marked the Mids' fifth one-goal game of the season, however the first one-goal contest that was not decided in extra minutes.
- Navy held Maryland scoreless for the first 41 minutes of the contest ... it was the Terps' first scoreless half since 2005 when Virginia defeated them, 10-2.
- The four-goal output by the Terps was also their lowest since that same Virginia loss in '05.
- Navy extended its winning streak to 21 in a row when holding its opponent to under seven or fewer goals.
- Maryland, on the other hand, held the Mids without a goal in the second half, marking Navy's first scoreless half since 1999 when Johns Hopkins dropped the Mids, 11-1.
- Senior attack **Nick Mirabito** had his 15-game point scoring streak snapped ... for just the second time in his 57-game career, he was held without a goal or an assist ... ironically, it was Maryland who snapped his 40-game streak just a year ago ... additionally, his 14-game streak with an assist was also stopped.
- Sophomore attack **Tim Paul** scored a pair of goals in the opening half, including his second game-winning goal of the season and third of his career ... he punched in the game-winner against Bucknell earlier this season with 1:20 remaining in overtime.

FAST FACTS

- Senior attack **Nick Mirabito** is one of seven players in the country with at least 18 goals and 18 assists ... he joins Duke's Matt Danowski (27-36) and Zack Greer (39-21), Syracuse's Mike Leveille (22-18), Ohio State's Joel Dalgarno (21-20) and Virginia's Garrett Billings (24-19) and Danny Glading (18-27) ... Mirabito has 18 goals and 19 assists in 2008.
- Sophomore attack **Tim Paul** has turned in multi-goal games seven times this season, while **Nick Mirabito** has five games with two or more goals.
- Six players on the roster have produced hat tricks during their careers, including four this season ... **Nick Mirabito** has pitched a hat trick in three games (14 in his career), while junior **Sean Standen** recorded his first collegiate three-goal performance in Navy's win over Lehigh ... sophomore **Tim Paul** produced his second collegiate hat trick with three markers against Holy Cross at Texas Stadium, while second-year midfielder **Patrick Moran** tallied his first three-goal game in the Mids' one-goal loss to No. 4 Georgetown.
- Navy has held the lead at halftime in 10 of the 11 games this season ... the Georgetown game is the only time the Mids have trailed at the break ... the Mids have lost 13 in a row when at the half and 58 straight when trailing after three quarters of play.
- The Mids have held seven of their last eight opponents to five or fewer goals, including No. 3 Maryland who scored just four goals after entering the game averaging more than 12 per game.
- The Mids have outscored their opponents, 21-8, in the first quarter this spring, including 10-2 in Patriot League play.
- Six different players have accounted for Navy's nine game-winners this season ... all upperclassmen, only one of the six had previously posted a game-winner during his career ... **Tim Paul** came into the season having scored one game-winner ... amazingly, despite being the Mids' eighth all-time goal scorer, senior **Nick Mirabito** owns just three game-winners and has been without a game-winning goal since his sophomore season.
- Navy has played a program-record four OT games this season and owns a 2-2 record in those contests ... Bucknell is the only team in the Patriot League who has forced the Midshipmen into extra minutes since Navy joined the conference in 2004 ... the Bison upset the Mids in 2005, 8-7, but dropped a 4-3 OT decision in Annapolis this season.
- Navy turned in back-to-back double-digit victories over Lehigh (14-3) and Holy Cross (16-3) marking the first time the Mids have achieved that feat since 2000 when Navy defeated Stony Brook, 16-4, followed by a 17-2 win over rival Academy Air Force in a span of just four days.
- Navy's 13-goal win over Holy Cross was the largest margin of victory by a Richie Meade-led team since 2006 when the Mids defeated Holy Cross by 14 (17-3) ... meanwhile it's tied as the seventh-largest margin of victory by Meade's Mids.

PATRIOT LEAGUE SUCCESS

• Since joining the Patriot League in 2004, Navy is 36-2 (.947) against opponents from the league, including an 8-0 mark in the Patriot League Tournament ... the Mids lost regular-season contests to Bucknell in '05 and Colgate in '06, both games were on the road.

• Navy has won 18 consecutive games against Patriot League teams ... its last loss was a 6-3 decision against Colgate on March 18, 2006, in Hamilton, N.Y.

• Navy owns a 14-game Patriot League regular-season winning streak ... it's the longest winning streak in conference play in the country ... ironically, Cornell and Georgetown, who both beat the Mids in overtime this season, are second with 13 wins in the Ivy and ECAC leagues, respectively.

• The Mids own a 19-0 record at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium against Patriot League competition since joining the conference ... the Mids are 13-0 during the regular season and 6-0 in the conference tournament.

• The Mids have produced undefeated marks in conference action twice, 7-0 in 2004 and 6-0 in '07.

• Navy has won at least a share of the Patriot League regular-season title in each of its five years as a member of the league, including this year ... additionally, the Mids have claimed the league's tournament crown four times with this year's tournament to be decided on April 25, 27 at a site to be determined.

• 24 different Mids have garnered All-Patriot League recognition, while 13 of the 24 have earned honors multiple times.

• Richie Meade was named the 2004 Patriot League Coach of the Year after leading the Mids to a flawless 7-0 mark in league competition ... he received the award a second time after guiding Navy to a 6-0 record last spring.

NATIONAL EXPOSURE

• Since the start of 2004, Navy has been on television 28 times (seven appearances in '04, six in '05 and '06, five in '07, four in '08).

• The Mids will make a minimum of six television appearances this season ... the Colgate (3/23), Georgetown (3/29) and Johns Hopkins (4/19) will be televised by CBS College Sports Network, while back-to-back road games at Maryland (4/4) and Army (4/12) will be aired by ESPNU ... the Mids' neutral site matchup against Cornell was televised tape-delayed by MASN on Feb. 28.

• The Mids own a 14-14 record when their games are televised ... Navy is 9-6 on CBS College Sports Network all-time and 5-5 on the ESPN family of networks ... the Mids are also 0-1 on Time-Warner Sports and 0-2 on MASN.

A DOMINANT STRETCH

- Navy is in the midst of one of its most dominant five-year runs in school history ... since the start of the 2004 season, Navy owns a 58-17 record (.773).
- Boasting 58 wins, Navy owns more victories over the last five years than any other Div. I program, while its .783 winning percentage is second behind Cornell (.794).
- During that same stretch, Navy is 24-15 (.615) against ranked teams and 34-2 mark (.944) against unranked foes.
- Since the start of the 2004 season, Navy owns a 8-7 (.533) record against teams ranked higher than it in the USILA Coaches Poll ... against lower ranked or unranked teams, Navy is 50-10 (.833).
- The Mids have posted a 29-7 (.806) record at home, outscoring their foes, 402-229 during that span ... just five teams have reached double digits on Navy's home field during that stretch.
- The Mids are also respectable on road, owning a 20-7 record (.741) in true road affairs over the last five years and defeating 12 ranked teams in the process ... two of Navy's seven road losses have come against unranked Patriot League opponents.
- Over the last five seasons, the Mids have produced the top-three win totals in school history ... in 2004, Navy won 15 games en route to its NCAA Championship game appearance and in 2005, the Mids produced 12 wins in earning their second-consecutive NCAA Tournament berth ... Navy won 11 games in 2006 and '07.
- The Class of 2007 became the winningest class in school history on March 21, 2007, when it claimed its 45th win in 56 contests ... the Class of '07 graduated having won 49 of its 64 contests (.766) ... the Class of '06 turned in a 44-18 record (.710) ... the Class of '08 owns a 43-14 record (.754).
- Behind a 12-1 win over Army in the Patriot League Tournament semifinals last spring, the Mids picked up their 10th win of the season, marking the fourth consecutive year Navy has won 10 or more games ... it's only the second time in program history and the first time since 1975-78, the Mids have strung together double-figure wins in four straight years (15 in 2004, 12 in 2005, 11 in 2006 and 11 in 2007).

TOUGH "D"

- Since 2000, Navy's defense has been ranked among the top four eight times ... meanwhile, it has been ranked No. 1 in the country four times, including this season ... giving up 4.85 goals per game, the Mids have surrendered 54 goals in 11 contests this season.
- The Mids have held nine of their 11 opponents to seven or fewer goals this season ... Navy has won 21 in a row when achieving that feat.
- Navy's defense has held six of its 11 opponents scoreless in the opening period, including five of the last eight (Bucknell, Colgate and Georgetown scored) ... the Mids have outscored their opponents, 21-8, in the first quarter, including 10-2 in Patriot League action.
- Maryland, who owned the nation's seventh-ranked scoring offense, was unable to score against the Mids' defense for the first 41 minutes of last Friday's game.
- Navy held Lehigh (3/11) and Holy Cross (3/15) to a combined 36 shots ... it held Lehigh without a shot in the first quarter of its game, while the Crusaders managed just two shots in the opening half.
- Since 2004, Navy has held 36 of its 75 opponents to 25 or fewer shots and is 33-3 (Ohio State 2004, Colgate 2006, Maryland 2007).
- Navy has lost just eight games when holding foes to nine or fewer goals since 2004, posting a 49-8 mark ... two of the losses came in overtime during the 2005 campaign (Bucknell and Johns Hopkins), losses in '06 were to Colgate, Georgetown (twice) and Johns Hopkins, while Maryland managed to nip the Mids in overtime in '07, as did Cornell in '08.
- Navy's defense has given up double-figure goals just six times in its last 41 games (2006-present), eight times in the last 57 (2005-present) and 12 times (Ohio State, Army, Johns Hopkins and Syracuse in '04, Georgetown and Virginia in '05, Army '06 and Colgate, Georgetown, Johns Hopkins and North Carolina in '07) in the last 75 games (2004-present).
- Dating back to 2003, Navy has won 36-straight games when holding its foes to five or fewer goals.

MIRABITO CLIMBS THE CHARTS

• Senior attack **Nick Mirabito** is active on Navy's career leader board in four categories — points, goals, assists and shots ... turn to page 30 in the notes package for an in-depth listing of the current leader board.

• Mirabito is one of just four players in the program's 101-year history who has scored 90 goals and dished out 50 assists ... he joins Mike Buzzell (111-111), Mike Herger (107-90) and former teammate Ian Dingman (125-63).

• Behind back-to-back career-high tying six-point performances against Lehigh (3/11) and Holy Cross (3/15), Mirabito moved into the top 10 of Navy's career points list ... with 149 points, he stands ninth and is four points shy of tying three-time All-American and eighth-place Dave Bayly who amassed 153 points (72-81) between 1972-74.

• Mirabito is only one point away of becoming only the ninth player in program history to reach 150 points ... should he achieve that feat, he would be just the third player under Richie Meade's guidance to do so and the third in the last three years (Jon Birsner with 154 in 2006; Ian Dingman with 188 in '07).

• Behind his two-goal, one-assist performance against No. 4 Georgetown, he also moved into ninth place in the Patriot League's all-time top-10 points record book ... Lehigh's Mark Duncan (91995-98) is eighth on the list with 160 points.

• Mirabito is ninth on Navy's career goals list with 91, just four shy of tying sixth-place holders Adam Borcz (1998-01) and Rich Wehman (1980-83) who each scored 95.

• Mirabito has turned in 20 or more goals in each of the previous three seasons ... with two regular-season games and at least one Patriot League Tournament contest remaining, he is just two goals from achieving the feat for a fourth time.

• With 58 career assists, Mirabito is 12th on the helpers chart ... he is five shy of tying former teammate and All-American Ian Dingman (2003-07) ... Mirabito needs 10 assists over the next three-plus games to finish his career in the top 10.

• Finally, Mirabito has moved into a tie for 13th on the career shots list, blasting 257 over four years ... he trails transfer Bob DeSimone (1974-75) by 11.

• Mirabito has been included on Inside Lacrosse's Player of the Year Watch feature for the last several weeks.

MAKING THEIR MARK

• Plenty has been made out of the number of new faces Navy has put out on the field this season ... in turn, plenty has been produced by those new faces.

• Seven of Navy's top 10 scorers (three tied for ninth) have recorded more points this season than they had coming into the year ... only senior **Nick Mirabito** and sophomores **Tim Paul** and **Basil Daratsos** had turned in more points ... the 10th player is newcomer **Andy Warner**, who was a senior in high school a year ago.

• Excluding Warner, three of the players (**Brendan Connors**, **Shane Durkin** and **Joe Lennon**) had never scored a point prior to this season.

FIRST-TIME GOAL SCORERS

• Twenty different players have scored goals for the Mids

this season, including junior defensive midfielder **Geoff Leone** who is the newest goal scorer after producing goals in back-to-back wins over Bucknell and Colgate ... 11 of those 20 are first-time scorers and only three of the 12 are freshmen.

• Scoring their first collegiate goals this season are: seniors **Dan Decker** and **Evan Boyle**, juniors **Michael Beggins**, **Shane Durkin**, **Bobby Lennon** and **Geoff Leone**, sophomores **Brendan Connors** and **Joe Lennon** and rookies **Kevin Doyle**, **Brian Striffler** and **Andy Warner**.

BALANCED SCORING

• Twenty players have scored goals for the Midshipmen this spring, while another four have posted assists, bringing the total to 24 different players having a role in Navy's scoring.

• Navy is one of just five schools to have 24 or more players produce a point this spring ... Duke leads all schools with 29 players scoring, while 24 have recorded points for Navy, Dartmouth, Hobart and Virginia.

• Only six teams have 20 or more players who have scored goals this season ... Duke has 25 goal scorers, followed by Virginia with 23 and Navy, Hobart, Lehigh and Notre Dame with 20.

• Of the 20 players who have scored goals for Navy, 14 of them have found the back of the goal at least twice.

• Five Mids have reached double figures in the points column this season ... a year ago, nine posted double digits and the previous season only seven.

• Six different players have accounted for Navy's eight game-winners this spring ... all upperclassmen, only one of the six had previously posted a game-winner during his career ... **Tim Paul** came into the season having scored the game-winner over No. 5 North Carolina a year ago.

• Navy's starting attack has combined to score 46 goals and added 28 assists (74 pts) ... the Mids' starting midfield line has contributed 26 goals and eight assists (34 pts).

- Navy owns a 29-7 record (.806) in games played at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium since the start of the 2004 campaign, outscoring its foes, 402-229 (11.2 to 6.4 gpg).
- This is the 47th season Navy has played at least one game at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.
- Having played at least a game a year at the stadium for 42 consecutive years, Navy stepped away in 2003, allowing for state-of-the-art renovations to take place, including the astroplay surface and two video boards ... Navy has played all of its home games at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium since the beginning of the 2004 campaign.
- Navy has not lost a Patriot League game at home in its five years as a member of the conference.
- The Mids have allowed just four teams (Colgate in '07; Georgetown in '05; Ohio State and Johns Hopkins in '04) to reach double digits in games played on their home field over the last five seasons ... Navy has held 15 of its 35 opponents to five or fewer goals since 2004 in games played at home.
- Navy owns a 69-28 (.711) record at home under the direction of head coach Richie Meade ... the Mids have reached four wins at home every season Meade has been the head coach, including this spring ... Navy has recorded five or more wins at home in six of Meade's 14 seasons, including seven wins in 2004, '05, '06 and '07.

FACEOFF FACTS

- Navy is ranked 11th in the country in faceoff percentage, winning 57.7 percent (112-194) of its draws this spring ... Yale is the nation's leader (.675).
- Senior faceoff specialist **Mikelis Visgauss** moved up to No. 5 from 8 after winning 10 of his 13 draws against third-ranked Maryland last Friday ... he has won 62.1 percent (87-140) of his faceoffs ... Syracuse's Danny Brennan is atop the leader board winning 69.3 percent of his faceoffs.
- Visgauss has been above 60 percent from the faceoff "x" in five games this year, including the Maryland contest in which it was the first time in his career he has won better than 70 percent of the draws.
- With his seven wins at Lafayette, Visgauss moved into the top 10 on Navy's career faceoff wins list ... he has since moved into eighth (142 wins) where he trails seventh-place Dan Sullivan (1993-95) by just 12 wins.
- Visgauss is active on the Mids' single-season draws list, as well ... with his 13 wins against Georgetown (3/29), he vaulted into 11th and tacked on 10 wins last week to bring his total to 87 wins in 2008 ... he trails the ninth-place tandem of Chris Dingman (2003) and Jay James (2000) by just one and has Chris Dingman's 2002 mark of 93 wins well within sight.
- Visgauss is also one of the nation's best in ground balls, picking up 5.09 per game with is ranked 13th.

DINOLA NAMED TO TEWAARATON WATCH LIST

- Senior close defenseman **Jordan DiNola** is among 57 players who have been named to the 2008 Tewaaraton Award Preseason Watch List ... the Tewaaraton Trophy is awarded to the nation's top lacrosse player.
- The original list released on Feb. 21 named 51 players with six added on March 26.
- A two-time All-American, DiNola has seen action in 53 of the 57 games over his four-year career ... he's been a starter on Navy's nationally-ranked defense in each of the last three seasons ... he was voted the 2008 Patriot League Preseason Defensive Player of the Year.
- It's the fifth consecutive year a Navy player has been named to the watch list, joining Ian Dingman in 2004, Graham Gill Mitch Hendler, Steve Looney and Matt Russell in 2005, Ian Dingman, Billy Looney, Steve Looney and Matt Russell in 2006 and Billy Looney in 2007.

NATIONAL LEADER BOARD

- The NCAA released its fifth edition of statistics on Monday... the Mids are among the top 10 in scoring defense (1st), win percentage (5th), scoring margin (7th) and extra-man offense (10th) ... Navy is just outside the top 10 in faceoff percentage (11th), scoring offense (22) and man-down defense (32nd).
- After winning 10 of the 13 faceoffs in last Friday's win over third-ranked Maryland, senior **Mikelis Visgauss** is No. 5 in the nation with a 62.1 draw percentage and is 13th in ground balls per game (5.09) ... close defenseman **Andy Torney** is 36th in grounders, picking up 4.10 per contest.
- Junior **Andy Torney** is the nation's leader in ground balls by a close defenseman with 41, along with Virginia's Ken Clausen ... the duo ranks fifth among close defenseman and long stick defensive midfielders.
- Senior **Nick Mirabito** is among the top 20 in both points per game and assists per game ... he is 19th in points per game, averaging 3.36, while his 1.73 assists per game is the 16th-best mark in Div. I lax ... additionally, he is No. 63 in goals per game, poking in 1.64 per contest.
- Navy finished the 2007 campaign ranked among the top 10 in five statistical categories.

A CLOSER LOOK AT NAVY'S SCHEDULE

- Seven of Navy's 13 regular-season opponents this season are among the nation's top 20 teams according to the April 7 edition of the USILA Coaches Poll ... Georgetown (4), Cornell (5) and Maryland (7) are all among the top 10, while Bucknell (11), Johns Hopkins (13), Army (17) and Ohio State (19) round out Navy's ranked foes.
- Navy owns a 2-2 record against opponents who have appeared in the national rankings at the time of the contest.
- Since the start of the 2004 season, Navy has played 39 of its 75 games against teams ranked in the top 25, posting a 24-15 record (.615) ... two of the losses have come against the No. 1-ranked team in the country at the time (Johns Hopkins twice) ... meanwhile, five of the losses have been at the hands of Georgetown ('05, '06 2x, '07, '08) ... other losses to ranked teams in that span were against No. 20 Ohio State ('04), No. 4 Syracuse ('04), No. 7 Georgetown ('05), No. 6 Virginia ('05), No. 5 Georgetown ('06), No. 12 Johns Hopkins ('06), No. 5 Georgetown ('06), No. 7 Georgetown ('07), No. 11 Maryland ('07), No. 7 Johns Hopkins ('07), No. 9 North Carolina ('07) and No. 6 Cornell ('08).
- In fact, since the start of the 2000 campaign, 69 of Navy's 127 games have been against ranked teams ... in those games against ranked opponents, Navy is 36-33 (.522).
- In games against unranked foes since 2000, Navy is 53-5 (.914) ... the losses have come to UMBC ('01), Air Force and Penn State ('03), Bucknell ('05) and Colgate ('06).

TOURNEY TALK

- Navy has made four straight appearances in the NCAA Tournament and 24 in its 100 years of tradition
- Navy has played in the fifth-most NCAA Tournaments behind Johns Hopkins (36), Maryland (29), Virginia (29) and Syracuse (26).
- The last time Navy qualified for four-consecutive NCAA Tournaments was 1986-89 ... the Mids received a bye in the '86 tournament, while winning their first-round games in 1987-88-89.
- Navy is 4-5 in tournament action under 14th-year head coach Richie Meade.

NEUTRAL GROUND

- As a whole, neutral site games have been an oddity during the 101-year history at the Naval Academy ... just 17 games have been played on neutral ground.
- That said, during head coach Richie Meade's tenure, 14 games have been played at a neutral site, including two (Cornell, Holy Cross) this season.
- Navy owns an 11-6 overall record in neutral site matches, including a 10-4 mark under Meade.
- Over the last five seasons Richie Meade's Midshipmen have become accustomed to playing at least one neutral site regular-season game ... in 2004 Navy played Colgate in Orlando, in 2005, Navy opened the season against Providence by playing at Branford High School in Connecticut and later played Colgate in Orlando ... in 2006, Navy and Bucknell battled one another in San Diego at the First 4 Invitational ... in 2007, Navy faced Holy Cross in Texas ... this season, the Mids dropped a heartbreaker to Cornell in overtime in Long Island on Feb. 23 before taking down Holy Cross, 16-3, at Texas Stadium on March 15 as part of the eight-team, four-game Ford Patriot Cup.

- Each year head coach Richie Meade looks to his senior class to provide leadership for his team ... the Class of 2008 has been a part of one of the most successful periods in Navy lacrosse history.
- The Class of 2008 includes: Team captain **Jordan DiNola**, **Evan Boyle**, **Gregory Clement**, **Dan Decker**, **Matt Guido**, **Terence Higgins**, **Nick Mirabito**, **Brendan Teague**, **Dan Vassar**, **Mikelis Visgauss** and **Roger Wieland**.
- In four years, the Class of 2008 has accomplished quite a lot ... a 43-14 record, 21-2 Patriot League record
 - The most wins by a Div. I lax program in the last five years.
 - A share of four regular-season Patriot League crowns.
 - Three Patriot League Tournament titles with the possibility of a fourth as Navy has qualified for the 2008 Patriot League Tournament.
 - Three-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances.
 - 10-plus wins in three-straight years.

EXTRA MINUTES

- Four of Navy's 11 games this season have been decided in overtime ... the Mids have split decisions, winning two and dropping two ... it is the first time in program history that Navy has played four overtime games in a season.
- Navy owns a 13-16 overall record in overtime contests, including a 7-11 mark under head coach Richie Meade.
- Junior midfielder **Michael Beggins** scored the game-winner at Ohio State 2:05 into overtime ... it was his first collegiate goal.
- Navy surrendered the game-winner to Cornell's Chris Finn 1:23 into overtime.
- Second-year attack **Tim Paul** fired off a shot with 1:20 remaining in OT off a pass from leading scorer **Nick Mirabito** to lift the Mids past Bucknell, 4-3 ... it was Paul's first game-winner of the year and just the second of his collegiate career.
- Despite two good looks at the goal in overtime, a turnover by the Mids led to a Georgetown possession in transition with Ricky Mirabito, younger brother of Navy's **Nick Mirabito**, scoring the game-winner 2:18 into the extra period.
- Navy's 8-7 loss against Cornell marked the first time in program history that Navy has played an overtime game at a neutral site.
- The Bucknell win marked Navy's first OT win at home since defeating North Carolina on Feb. 28, 2003 ... that game, played at Rip Miller Field, was decided in the fourth extra period.
- The Bucknell win also marked the Mids' first OT win at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium since beating Stony Brook in triple overtime, 11-10, on March 23, 2002.
- Bucknell is the only Patriot League team to take Navy to overtime since the Mids joined the conference in 2004 ... the Bison defeated Navy in an 8-7 decision in Lewisburg in 2005 ... it's one of only two regular-season Patriot League losses suffered by Navy in its five years as a member of the league.

CLASSROOM SUCCESS

- Senior faceoff specialist **Dan Decker** was recently selected as the 2008 winner of the W.H.G. FitzGerald Scholarship ... he is the 13th midshipman since the program's inception to receive the scholarship.
- The W.H.G. FitzGerald Scholarship Fund provides Naval Academy scholars an opportunity to attend Oxford University for two years of study ... scholarship recipients must demonstrate "scholarly attainment, leadership ability and the capacity for devotion to a cause beyond self."
- The program was established by former Ambassador to the Republic of Ireland and founder and chairman of the board of the North American Housing Corporation William H.G. FitzGerald, Class of 1931 ... a former baseball player at the Naval Academy, the clubhouse at Terwilliger Brothers Field at Max Bishop Stadium is named after FitzGerald.
- Decker is a four-year member and two-time letterwinner ... an honors student majoring in systems engineering, he stands 36th in academic order of merit among his class of 1,064 ... he boasts a 3.93 cumulative grade-point average.
- He has been named to the Superintendent's and Commandant's List all seven semesters ... additionally, he has earned a 4.00 GPA in five semesters (includes '06 summer session).
- His curriculum includes Systems Engineering Design, Digital Control Systems, Advanced Technologies, Arabic Dialect and Law for the Junior Officer ... he has received only three B's during his four years at the Academy.
- While Decker is ranked 36th in academics, he is No. 2 in military order of merit and 11th in overall order of merit, which combines the two disciplines.
- He has been named to the Patriot League Academic Honor Roll in each of the last two seasons.

A balanced attack and a stifling defense led 12th-ranked Navy (1-0) to a 10-2 victory over VMI (0-1) in Annapolis. It was the earliest Navy has played a season-opener and the first game on tap this season in Div. I lacrosse.

The Mids' balanced offensive attack featured eight different players scoring Navy's 10 goals, including four first-time scorers.

Navy opened up a 3-0 lead after the first 15 minutes of play with sophomore attack **Tim Paul** punching in the season's first goal for the Mids at the 8:27 mark. The play was cued by first-year starting keeper **Matt Coughlin** whose outlet pass to mid-field field set up the goal. A few quick one-timers around and rookie attack **Andy Warner** saw Paul cutting to the crease and Paul popped it in over VMI keeper Sean McCoy's shoulder.

Navy's next two goals were near mirror images of one another as sophomore middle **Patrick Moran** ripped the back of the next from 10 yards out at 7:20, followed by junior midfielder **Shane Durkin's** first-collegiate goal from just outside of 10 yards.

VMI finally got on the board when Hill made a sensational move curling around the backside of the goal and shooting the ball as he left his feet. Horizontal to the goal, Hill somehow threaded the ball between the defender and Coughlin to narrow the margin to two (3-1) with more than 10:30 remaining in the second quarter.

While Navy would go on to get just one goal in the second stanza, the marker by sophomore midfielder **Joe Lennon**, his first, at 5:30 would be the first of seven consecutive goals for the Midshipmen.

Navy pushed its lead to 8-1 after three quarters with goals from senior **Nick Mirabito**, **Sean Standen**, Warner and **Bobby Lennon**. Warner, meanwhile, scored his first collegiate goal when senior midfielder **Terence Higgins** intercepted a pass at mid-field and got it to Mirabito who then fed Warner. Additionally, the elder Lennon, Bobby, also scored his first collegiate goal, as senior attack **Matt Guido** sent him the ball with 1:02 remaining in the third quarter.

Paul scored his second goal off Mirabito's second assist at 9:19, while Standen turned in his second collegiate multi-goal game when he punched in his second with 7:43 remaining in the game to give Navy a 10-1 lead.

The Keydets stopped the Navy run at 6:06 when Tim Moran fed Brett Leonard for the score with 6:06 to go in the contest.

Navy's defense forced 21 Keydet turnovers, including 13 in the first half. Meanwhile, it held VMI to just 21 shots.

Scoring his first-collegiate goal, junior midfielder **Michael Beggins** ripped a shot at keeper Stefan Schroder's ankles just over two minutes into overtime to lead 12th-ranked Navy (2-0) to an 8-7 victory over Ohio State (0-1) at The 'Shoe in Columbus, Ohio.

Navy, who led by as many as four goals early in the second half, held a one-goal lead with 10 seconds remaining when OSU forced a Navy turnover. The Buckeyes sent an outlet pass up the sideline where it was met by Preseason All-American attack Kevin Buchanan who took a shot from eight yards out on the right wing and scored as time ran out.

Navy senior **Mikelis Visgauss** won a crucial faceoff to start the overtime period, giving the Mids possession. Navy would fired off five shots, including a one-timer by Beggins that would be knocked down by Schroder, but kept in play. Sophomore **Joe Lennon** took the next shot that clanged off the far post before **Basil Daratsos** hit the cross bar. Finally, Beggins was fed the ball and fired in what will be a memorable goal for he and his teammates.

It was a battle for momentum throughout the game, as Navy opened up a 3-0 lead with 4:45 remaining in the first period. Sophomore **Tim Paul** gave Navy the lead just 46 seconds into the game, as he scored an extra-man goal after a slashing was called on on the opening face-off.

OSU finally got on the board when Buchanan punched in the first of his three goals at 3:52 in the first stanza.

The Buckeyes did a fine job of possessing the ball in the early minutes of the second quarter. Junior Peet Poillon pulled the Buckeyes to within one at 3-2 when he topshelved his shot past junior keeper **Matt Coughlin** at 10:32.

Navy, though, cushioned its lead when senior **Gregory Clement** found Lennon who was successful by going high to low and sneaking his shot past Schroder's right ankle.

Leading 4-2 to open the second half, Navy wasted little time in attacking, as Paul produced his second goal of the day on a 10-yarder 53 seconds into the third, followed by a pretty play by Daratsos who threaded a pass through OSU's zone and found **Nick Mirabito**.

Joel Dalgarno's goal with 10:34 left in the third was the first of four-consecutive goals for the Buckeyes which featured back-to-back goals just 33 seconds apart that knotted the game at six apiece.

At the 4:20 mark, Clement scored the go-ahead goal for the Mids when he was met by an Ohio State defender and was forced to shoot the ball behind his back. The pretty shot surprised Schroder who stood between the pipes and gave way to a 7-6 Navy lead.

Junior attack Chris Finn scored an unassisted goal just over a minute into overtime to lead No. 6 Cornell (1-0) to an 8-7 victory over 12th-ranked Navy (2-1) at Mitchel Athletic Complex in Uniondale, N.Y. Navy held a two-goal lead with a minute remaining in regulation, but goals by Ryan Hurley (0:53) and All-American Max Seibald (0:12) left Navy without an answer to the Big Red's furious fury in suffering its first loss of the 2008 campaign.

Cornell took an early 2-0 lead in the game as Ryan Hurley fed Mike Corbolotti from behind the cage and Corbolotti stuck the goal from the crease. With just under four minutes remaining in the opening period, Hurley curled around the right side of the cage, sneaking his shot past junior keeper **Matt Coughlin**.

Navy trimmed the lead to one just a minute later when Cornell keeper Jake Myers was unable to come up with the ball after stopping **Shane Durkin's** shot. The ball popped back out in front of the cage where senior **Nick Mirabito** scooped up the ball and scored.

Navy ended the half by scoring four goals in just over four minutes, including a 10-yarder from sophomore midfielder **Basil Daratsos** who was able to get around his defender and spark the Navy run at 4:07.

With just 15.6 seconds remaining in the opening half, Navy took a 5-4 lead when rookie **Andy Warner** curled around the right side of the cage looking for a crease man to cut. His pass ricocheted off a Cornell defender and shot up over the keeper's reach and into the goal.

Navy's defense played its best game of the year in the third quarter, holding the Big Red to just one shot.

With four seconds remaining in the quarter, Myers had the ball in the cage where he was looking to throw an outlet pass. Instead, his pass went straight into the outstretched stick of Mirabito standing at the crease and Mirabito completed the hat trick, giving the Mids a 6-4 lead heading into the final stanza.

The Mids took advantage of a Cornell foul as Mirabito found sophomore **Patrick Moran** to push Navy's lead to a comfortable three-goal margin at 7-4.

John Espey cut the Navy lead to two when he wrapped around the left side and sent a shot from five yards out.

Cornell forced a Navy turnover with just over a minute to play with Seibald throwing the outlet pass to Glynn who found Hurley and he sank his 10-yard shot with 53 seconds remaining.

With 12.8 seconds left, Seibald sank an 8-yard shot over the shoulder of Coughlin and sent the game into OT.

Navy's starting attack scored six goals and pitched in five assists to lead the 10th-ranked Midshipmen to a 12-5 victory over Mount St. Mary's (0-2) at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.

Senior **Nick Mirabito** led the Mids with five points on a team-best three goals and two assists. Navy saw second-year attack **Tim Paul** punch in two goals, while assisting on two others and senior **Gregory Clement** turned in a goal and an assist.

The game got off to a slow start as both teams found it difficult to take care of the ball. Though Mount St. Mary's seemed to have possession for much of the early portion of the game, it managed just one shot in the opening 15 minutes. Navy finally got on the scoreboard when Paul fed Clement from behind the goal and Clement stuck the ball over rookie keeper T.C. DiBartolo's shoulder at 4:37.

Navy added to its lead just before the end of the quarter when sophomore **Brendan Connors** found **Michael Beggins** who ripped a 10-yarder from the left side with 51 seconds remaining. It was the first assist of Connors' career.

Mount St. Mary's briefly stopped the Mids by scoring an extra-man goal at 12:09 in the second stanza. Top returning scorer Joe Derwent worked with Geery Grant to narrow Navy's lead to just one (2-1).

The Mids went on to score the next three goals to lead 5-1 with 3:27 to go in the opening half. Among the three goals was a nice transition play that began behind the Mount St. Mary's cage with defensive midfielder **Bobby Lennon** picking up the loose ball. Lennon sent an outlet pass to mid-field where **Zack Schroeder** quickly found Paul. Paul took off with only the keeper to beat and after cocking back, he unleashed a powerful shot that rippled the back of the net before DiBartolo realized it was out of Paul's stick.

It was the Mount who got the final say by half's end as Dan Mohr stationed himself on the far left crease where Jim O'Shea threaded a pass and Mohr scored on an ankle biter to send Mount St. Mary's to the locker room down, 5-2.

Navy opened up an 8-2 lead four minutes into the final half by scoring three quick goals, including an extra-man strike by sophomore **Joe Lennon** 21 seconds into the half.

The two teams traded goals to wind down the third period with the Midshipmen holding a comfortable 9-3 lead.

The fourth quarter featured five goals, three by Navy and a pair by the Mount. Two of Navy's three goals in the final stanza were scored by sophomore local product **Patrick Moran**, who finished with two goals and an assist.

The Mount, whose team is made up of half freshmen, were led by Mohr and O'Shea who each pitched in a pair of goals to go along with Geery's strike. Making just his second collegiate appearance, DiBartolo was sensational in the goal early on, making 13 stops.

Tenth-ranked Navy (4-1, 1-0 PL) let little stand in its way of picking up a victory over Lafayette (2-2, 0-1 PL) in its Patriot League opener, not even the weather. After a 15-minute delay due to lightning, the Mids braved a driving rain storm that included periods of sleet and wind gusts of 20 miles per hour as they cruised to an 8-5 win over the Leopards.

Due to the rain-soaked turf and the pouring rain, both teams had a difficult time holding onto the ball early in the game. The two teams finally settled down and into an offense after the first five minutes and Navy got on the scoreboard when Sophomore midfielder **Joe Lennon** found an opening past Lafayette keeper Jeff Canfield at the 8:30 mark. Just under two minutes elapsed when senior **Nick Mirabito** sat behind the goal and found **Gregory Clement** standing on the crease, giving Navy a 2-0 advantage.

The Mids pushed their lead to 4-0 when junior **Shane Durkin** and Lennon scored back-to-back goals a minute apart from nearly the same position on the field. Lennon's shot was perfectly placed as he was able to bounce it through Canfield's legs for his second score of the day.

To Lafayette's credit, it remained poised and freshman attack Tom Perini, like so many times this season, carried the torch to get his Leopards back into the game. Working with second-year attack Matt Mersky, Perini punched in back-to-back goals at 6:52 and 4:09 to narrow the Mids' lead to just two.

Navy, answered however, as Mirabito fed sophomore attack **Tim Paul** at the crease and Paul was forced to shoot the ball from over his shoulder, rippling the net to give Navy a 5-2 lead with three minutes remaining in the half.

With 2:02 to go, the Mersky-Perini combination struck once again with Perini turning in the hat trick to cut Navy's lead to 5-3 heading into the half.

The Mids opened the second half with a quick strike from Clement, who fired off a 10-yard shot from the left side off Lennon's pass. Though Navy struck quickly, it would be the only goal scored in the period by either team, as the Mids' defense held the Leopards to just one shot in the third.

Lafayette cut into Navy's lead just eight seconds into the final stanza when Mersky was found to be in the right place at the right time. He picked up a ground ball on the doorstep after Navy's **Matt Coughlin** stopped a Lafayette shot, but was unable to reel it in. Mersky grabbed the grounder and poked it in. The Leopards got as close as just one goal with 10 minutes remaining in the game when starting middle Steve Serling scored an unassisted goal.

Less than 90 seconds later, Lennon fed sophomore midfielder **Patrick Moran** to push Navy's lead to two and Mirabito fired in his lone goal of the day to seal the win for the Mids with 4:18 remaining.

Turning in his first collegiate hat trick, junior midfielder **Sean Standen** was one of eight different players to score for the Mids as 11th-ranked Navy rolled to a 14-3 victory over Lehigh at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. The Mids, who are now 5-1 overall and 2-0 in conference play, have won 23 consecutive games against the Mountain Hawks.

Not only did Standen score goals a plenty, so, too, did **Gregory Clement**, **Tim Paul**, **Nick Mirabito** and **Patrick Moran**, who each pitched in a pair of goals, while Mirabito added a career-high four assists to finish with six points.

Navy's defense complemented its offense, holding Lehigh without a shot in the opening period and 23 for the game. It marked the fourth time this season that Navy's opponent has been held scoreless in the opening 15 minutes of action, including the third straight game. The Mountain Hawks scored their first goal of the game at 8:29 in the second and would not score again until two minutes into the fourth quarter.

The Mids opened up a four-goal lead by the early minutes of the second quarter. Moran punched in a pair of goals, including the game's opening marker just 1:05 into the contest. Mirabito, meanwhile, fed Navy's final three goals in the run.

Lehigh briefly interrupted Navy's run when Max Dahlem fired in a shot off an unsettled play at 8:29.

Navy answered seven minutes later when senior Clement scored an extra-man goal off a pass from none other than Mirabito. His goal at 1:39 was the first of six straight goals for the Mids.

The Mids ended the half leading 6-1 after Clement tucked in his second goal with just 14 ticks remaining in the opening half. Coughlin stepped up and made a sensational save against defenseman Dan Honeywell, he then sent the outlet pass to Paul who was stationed at mid-field. Paul sprinted towards the box and made the pass to Clement who sent it sailing over the shoulder of Lehigh's Eric Spirko.

Navy outscored Lehigh 4-0 in the third quarter, which featured several impressive plays by the Mids. Paul fired a shot at 12:17 that came out of his stick so hard and so fast, Spirko never moved. Surrendering just two shots in the opening half, 11th-ranked Navy jumped out to a 10-0 halftime lead and went on to capture a 16-3 victory over Holy Cross in the second of four games played at Texas Stadium as part of the 2008 Ford Patriot Cup. Eleven different players scored for the Midshipmen including senior **Nick Mirabito** who turned in his second consecutive six-point performance that featured two goals and four assists.

Mirabito served as the team's catalyst from the opening whistle, as he had a hand in each of the Mids' first five goals. Navy scored the game's first goal five minutes into the contest when Mirabito found fellow attack **Tim Paul** standing on the crease and Paul punched in the first of his team-leading three goals in the game.

Holy Cross was attempting to clear the ball when Mirabito intercepted the pass just shy of mid-field. Mirabito was off to the races, beating a long pole, as well as Harrison who came out of the goal to assist with the clearing play. Mirabito scored his second goal from seven yards out into an empty goal.

After he had his earlier shot in the game turned away, Lennon pushed the Navy lead to 11-0 just 54 seconds into the second half when he muscled a shot past Harrison.

Holy Cross finally got on the scoreboard when Toby Banta fed John Marino who struck with a five-yarder from the left side of the cage at 12:03. The Crusaders put a second goal on the board at 9:22 when Luke Marchand set up from 12 yards out, shooting the ball hard and over Navy keeper **Matt Coughlin's** left shoulder.

Navy, though, would get score the quarter's final goal with Lennon firing in his second goal of the day with 2:15 remaining.

The Mids scored four of the game's final five goals, including a marker at 13:51 by senior **Evan Boyle** who scored his first collegiate goal. Also scoring his first collegiate goal was rookie **Kevin Doyle** who finished with a pair of goals, including his first in the second period and second in the final stanza.

After being shut down nearly the entire game by a swarming Bucknell zone defense, Navy sophomore attack **Tim Paul** broke free of his defender and sank a shot over back-up keeper Matt Antonelli's shoulder with 1:20 remaining in overtime to lead No. 8 Navy to a 4-3 victory over the No. 12 Bison at a soggy Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.

The win was Navy's first overtime victory at home since Feb. 20, 2003, when the Mids earned a marathon four-overtime victory (9-8) over North Carolina at Rip Miller Field. Meanwhile, it's the Mids' first overtime win at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium since they claimed an 11-10 triple-overtime victory over Stony Brook on March 23, 2002. Three of Navy's eight games this season have gone into extra minutes, the most overtime games a Navy team has played in a single season in program history.

Tied up at two apiece with 10 minutes remaining in the contest, Navy junior midfielder **Shane Durkin** scored his fourth goal of the year and gave the Mids a 3-2 lead with 5:04 to go. With under three minutes to play, midfielder Nick Marks sent a lefty shot from 15 yards out over the left shoulder of Navy reserve goalkeeper **Tommy Phelan** who came into the game in relief of junior keeper **Matt Coughlin** following Bucknell's game-tying goal in the fourth quarter.

The Mids had a final opportunity to score in the closing seconds of regulation after a Bucknell turnover gave Navy the ball. Defensive midfielder **Geoff Leone** ran the length of the field before dishing off to senior **Gregory Clement** on the crease. Antonelli, however, came up with a big save, but the ball bounced back into play where defensive midfielder **Bobby Lennon** snatched the ball and sent what he had hoped to be the game-winning shot just high.

Navy senior **Mikelis Visgauss** won the overtime faceoff and middle **Basil Daratsos** got a solid look at the goal. However, Antonelli made one of his game-high 11 saves to turn back Daratsos' shot, giving the Bison possession. But Bucknell, who turned the ball over 21 times in the game, failed to clear the ball as the pass sailed out of bounds to give the Midshipmen possession.

After working the ball around, Navy's leading scorer **Nick Mirabito**, anchored to the right of the goal, saw Paul on the far left side and lobbed the ball over the defense to Paul who drilled a low-to-high shot to give Navy the victory.

Both teams' defensive units were on mark in the game in what was the lowest goal output by both Bucknell and Navy. The Mids put 17 of their 32 shots on goal, however, Antonelli and starting keeper Nick Sciubba combined to turn away 13 of the Mids' shots. Meanwhile, Coughlin played his most impressive game in goal for the Mids, making a career-high 10 saves before coming out of the game with 10 minutes left in regulation.

Making 13 saves in his first collegiate start, junior keeper **Tommy Phelan** anchored a Navy defense that held Colgate scoreless for nearly 54 minutes en route to earning an 8-3 victory over the Raiders in Hamilton, N.Y. Phelan, who played the final minutes of Wednesday's 4-3 overtime win over Bucknell, was inserted into the starting lineup after starting net minder **Matt Coughlin** suffered an injury in the fourth quarter of the Bucknell contest.

Navy's starting attack accounted for five of the Mids' eight goals, including a hat trick by senior **Nick Mirabito**, while sophomore **Tim Paul** ended the game with a pair of goals and an assist.

Colgate scored the game's first goal when senior middle Matt Lalli settled in on the right side behind the cage where he backed up Navy pole **Jake Brosnan** enough to get some separation between he and Phelan for the score at 9:16.

Navy countered three minutes later when Paul picked up a loose ball on a failed clearing attempt by the Raiders and went top shelf on Colgate keeper Tim Harrington from seven yards out. Paul's goal at 6:19 in the first triggered an 8-0 run by the Mids that was capped off by an unassisted goal by defensive midfielder **Geoff Leone** off a Colgate turnover with 4:42 remaining in the game.

Navy scored three goals in the second stanza, including an extra-man goal by sophomore midfielder **Patrick Moran** who was fed by classmate **Basil Daratsos** to give the Mids' a 4-1 advantage at the half.

The Mids scored the first three goals in the second half, scoring the trio of goals in 1:45. Mirabito scored two of the three, including a marker that began with sophomore long pole midfielder **Zach Schroeder** who caused a Colgate turnover, quickly picked up the loose ball and scampered to the box where he found Mirabito for the goal.

With the game well in hand, Navy let down its guard a bit in the closing minute of the game, giving up a pair of goals in the final 54 seconds. Patriot League Offensive Player of the Year Brandon Corp nearly had his lengthy scoring streak come to a halt, but was able to convert on a Navy turnover, sending the ball over Phelan's left shoulder. After winning the ensuing draw, senior faceoff specialist **Mikelis Visgauss** overthrew his teammate, turning the ball back over to Colgate with under 35 seconds to go.

Lalli would end up with the ball on his knees and his back to the goal, flinging the ball over his right shoulder and finding the back of the net with 26 seconds remaining.

Though Visgauss made the mistake at the end of the game, it was his play at the faceoff "x" that helped spark the Mids' offense. After losing the first three draws of the game, he came back to win seven of the last 12, including three of four in the third quarter.

Tenth-ranked Navy outscored No. 4 Georgetown, 7-4, in the second half, but it was Hoyas rookie Ricky Mirabito who would play the spoiler as his crease-line goal led Georgetown to an 11-10 overtime victory against the Mids at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium. Navy midfielder **Basil Daratsos** evened the score with 38.9 seconds left in regulation, but it was not to be as the Mids dropped just their second game of the 2008 campaign.

The Hoyas opened up the game by scoring on an errant clearing pass by keeper **Tommy Phelan**. After coming up with a spot-on save against senior attack Andrew Baird, Phelan threw the ball right back into Baird's stick and easily beat Phelan to put the Hoyas up at 8:24 in the game.

In what seemed like a blink of an eye, Georgetown owned a 5-1 lead and Navy was forced to work itself out of a tough deficit. And midway through the third quarter, Georgetown owned an 8-3 lead after scoring the first two goals of the second half.

Moran, however, sparked a four-goal run by Navy with back-to-back goals less than a minute apart (6:18, 5:25). Also in the mix were **Nick Mirabito** from **Terence Higgins** and an incredible behind the back goal by **Gregory Clement** with 1:01 remaining in the third.

But like the second quarter, Navy was unable to keep the Hoyas under wraps and with 19.2 seconds left in the quarter, Jake Samperton put Georgetown back up by two.

A minute and a half into the fourth quarter, Daratsos picked up a loose ball just outside of the crease and poked in his first goal since the Cornell game. All-American attack Brendan Cannon came alive and scored a six-yarder from the left side of the field to give the Hoyas a two-goal advantage with 3:28 remaining.

Forty seconds later, Navy countered with Clement's second goal to get the Mids within one. Daratsos scored the game-tying goal by drilling a shot from nearly 10 yards out.

Senior captain **Jordan DiNola** picked off a pass on the defensive end of the field and found shorty **Geoff Leone** who scampered to the box where he found starting attack **Tim Paul** who whaled a shot in the direction of Kass. Kass made a nice save and quickly threw the ball the length of the field where waiting on the other end was Baird who caught the ball and shot. Phelan, who was out of the goal, made an amazing kick save to stymie what would have been the game-tying shot with 00.3 remaining.

After winning the overtime faceoff and seeing shots by Moran and **Joe Lennon** go wide, the Mids turned the ball over. Georgetown's Cannon found Ricky Mirabito sitting on the crease in transition and the younger Mirabito brother punched in the game-winner 2:18 into the extra period to dash Navy's upset hopes.

Anchored by a stingy defense that kept third-ranked Maryland scoreless for the first 41 minutes of the contest, No. 9 Navy held off a furious comeback by the Terps to earn a 5-4 victory at Byrd Stadium in College Park.

The first quarter featured a combined 14 turnovers between the two teams and 12 shots, including a 10-yarder by midfielder **Patrick Moran** that managed to find its way through Maryland keeper Brian Phipps' legs to give the Mids a 1-0 lead seven minutes into the contest.

Navy's offense flourished in the second quarter, as the Mids put 10 of their 14 shots on goal, scoring four goals by quarter's end. The first was a bouncer by middle **Joe Lennon** from 13 yards out at the 11:47 mark.

The Mids scored back-to-back goals a minute apart, including an extra-man strike by attack **Tim Paul** from Moran at 4:41. A minute later, attack **Gregory Clement** sat on the crease and converted a **Matt Bitter** pass to push the Mids' lead to 4-0. With just 44 seconds remaining in the half, defensive midfielder **Geoff Leone** penetrated up the middle before giving the ball up to Paul for his second goal.

With no goals at the break, it was the first time the Terps have been held scoreless since April 2, 2005, when Virginia defeated Maryland 10-2.

Navy's defense continued to smother the Terps early on in the second half, but a busted assignment left rookie Ryan Young alone behind the cage and he was easily able to loop his pass to senior Drew Evans to end Maryland's scoreless streak at 4:03 in the third. Maryland put up a second goal when it executed its first of two extra-man goals, as Max Ritz found Dan Groot who produced his ninth goal of the year straight up the gut.

Maryland scored a pair of goals less than two minutes apart in the fourth quarter to narrow Navy's lead to one.

Navy, who saw several quality shots either gobbled up by keeper Jason Carter or clang off the pipe, was held scoreless in the second half, marking its first scoreless half since dropping an 11-1 decision to Johns Hopkins in 1999.

With under a minute to play, Navy worked the ball to the offensive end of the field, but Paul was stripped and Maryland grabbed the ball and rushed down the field. Junior Jeff Reynolds eventually got his feet set and cranked a shot that was broken up by a Navy defenseman and sailed above the goal and out of play.

Navy's **Tommy Phelan** enjoyed a strong night in goal for the Mids where he made 11 saves, five in the first half and six in the second. Navy's defense, ranked No. 1 in the country, held Maryland to just four goals, its lowest goal output since its 10-2 loss at Virginia in April of 2005. The Terps entered the game ranked seventh in the country by averaging 12.2 goals per game.
