Mids Take on Trojans in National Semifinals on Saturday

The Navy Water Polo team begins its quest for its first national championship on Saturday evening with a national semifinals matchup against top-ranked and undefeated USC. The fourth-seeded and 11th-ranked Mids enter the tournament with a 20-9 overall record, while USC is 27-0. The other semifinal pits the second seed and No. 3-ranked Stanford (24-5) against third-seeded and fifth-ranked Loyola Marymount (20-9). Navy and USC will be the first game, beginning at 5:00 pm PT (8:00 pm ET). The second game will start at 6:45 pm PT.

Navy Looks To Make History

One year after becoming the first Eastern team to win a NCAA Tournament game since 2002, Navy is looking to become the first Eastern team to reach the title game in NCAA history. Since the field was reduced to four teams in 1995, no Eastern team has won a semifinal game and no Eastern team has ever appeared in the NCAA title game. Navy enters tournament play with a 6-29 all-time record in 13 previous appearances. Navy's 14th appearance is its third in a row and the sixth most in NCAA history. USC and Stanford have combined for 13 of the previous 39 NCAA titles, while Navy and Loyola Marymount are looking for its first title. Neither Navy nor LMU has made the NCAA title game.

Mids Claim Back-to-Back-to-Back Eastern Titles

Navy earned a trip to the NCAA Tournament for the third straight year after winning its ninth Eastern Championship two weeks ago. The Midshipmen are making their third straight appearance in the tournament for the first time since making five straight trips from 1990-94. It will be Navy's fifth trip since 1995, when the current four-team format went into effect. Navy has won five of its nine Eastern titles in the last nine years (since 2000).

In last year's semifinal match against the eventual champion, California, the Mids dropped a tough 8-5 decision. Navy led early on, but trailed 7-5 late in the contest. With a great look at the goal to cut the lead to one, the shot went wide and California added an insurance goal to round out the scoring. Two years ago, Navy was overwhelmed by USC, 20-3, in the semifinals.

Have We Met Before?

The Mids will face an old nemesis in the NCAA Tournament in the first round in USC. The Trojans and Mids have met six times in the NCAA Championship, with the Trojans winning all six by an average margin of 7.0 goals per game. In the two teams' last meeting in the 2006 semifinals, USC topped the Mids, 20-3. USC is 10-0 all-time against Navy, including 6-0 in the NCAA Tourney.

Navy defeated Loyola Marymount in last year's third-place game, 7-6. The Lions have defeated the Midshipmen this year, 9-4, in the NorCal Tournament on Sept. 20. The Lions own a 4-3 series advantage and the two teams have split two meetings in the NCAA Tournament.

Stanford owns a 10-0 advantage against Navy, including a 13-4 victory in the Princeton Invitational on Sept. 13. The teams haven't met in the NCAA Tournament since 1993.

Under Head Coach Mike Schofield

- Owns a stellar 531-205 career record. His teams have won at least 19 games in all 24 years in charge at Navy, and have lost double-digit games just seven times.
- Over the last four years, Navy is 95-28 (.772).
- Just one coach in Navy's illustrious athletic history, baseball's Joe Duff (595), has won more games at Navy than Schofield. Duff needed 32 years to record his 595 wins.
- Has guided Navy to nine Eastern Championships in his 24 years, including back-to-back-to-back titles in 1986-87-88 and 2006-07-08.
- Won his 500th career game against Johns Hopkins on Oct. 21, 2007, an 11-7 triumph.
- Has guided 21 All-Americans, 42 All-East members and 11 Eastern Championship MVPs during his time at Navy.
- Has had three NCAA All-Tournament performers in the last two years (Aaron Recko in 2006 and 2007, and Michael Mulvey in 2007).

Mids On A Historic Eastern Run

Navy became the first team to win the CWPA Eastern title three years in a row twice when it accomplished the feat two weeks ago. Just four other teams (Yale in 1972-74; Bucknell in 1977-80; Brown in 1983-85; Navy in 1986-88 and UMass in 1993-96) have won at least three titles in a row. UMass and Bucknell have won four titles in a row and Navy will be looking to do that next year.

► This year's senior class has a four-year record of 72-8 (.900) against teams from the East. In addition, the senior class owns a 96-30 (.762) overall record.

► Since resurrecting the program in 1982, Navy has had at least 19 wins in all 27 seasons. Navy has won at least 20 games in all but four of those seasons, including last year's school-record 30-6 campaign.

► Navy has won nine straight CWPA Eastern Tournament games, and is just three one-goal losses from winning 23 straight Eastern Tournament games and seven straight titles. Navy lost by one goal to St. Francis in 2005 (10-9), St. Francis in 2004 (8-7) and Queens in 2002 (5-4).

Mulvey Capping Off Record-Breaking Campaign

Michael Mulvey is closing out a start-studded career and will go down as one of the best players in Navy water polo history. Mulvey was named the Eastern MVP and the Southern MVP and should become Navy's first first-team All-American in school history, after earning honorable mention accolades last year.

► Mulvey currently has 101 points (59 g, 42 a) this year, ranking 10th on the single-season list, and becoming the first player since 2000 to reach 100 points in a season. He has a legitimate shot at ending in the top six for season points (sixth is Brian Wineke with 108 points in 1993). His 42 assists already rank fourth on the Navy single-season list.

► In the career record books, Mulvey's 310 points rank fifth and it will stay that way as current Navy volunteer assistant coach **Cmdr. Tom Popp, USN**, is fourth with 337 points. Mulvey has 203 career goals, good for sixth and 107 career assists, good for a tie for second.

Honors Flood In For Several Players

Despite winning the Eastern title and the Southern regular-season title, Navy received little love on the all-conference teams.

► Mulvey was a first-team All-East selection and MVP, while **Johnny Meiners** was a second-team All-East honoree. In addition, freshman **Kyle Wertz** has named the East's Outstanding Rookie. Navy was awarded with just two spots on the two teams, while runner-up Princeton had four first-team honorees.

► Meanwhile, on the South team, Mulvey was a first-team honoree, while **Chuck Baker** was second team. Despite winning the regular-season crown, Navy had two players earn honors, while Bucknell and Princeton led the way with four. Princeton finished second, while Bucknell finished fourth in the standings.

Wertz, Rajchel Also Set Marks

Two big question marks entering the year for Navy was how good the goalkeeping would be and who would step up as a second scorer. Both questions have been answered in positive fashion.

► **Brett Rajchel** has started all 29 games in goal and has 232 saves to rank seventh on the single-season Navy chart. His 232 saves are the 19th most in the nation. He has made over 10 saves in a game 10 different times, including in four of the last five games.

► Meanwhile, freshman **Kyle Wertz** ranks second on the team with 56 points and 42 goals. The 56 points are the most for a Navy freshman since Joe Donahue scored 66 (45 g, 21 a) in 2000. The 56 points are the fourth most for a Navy freshman in school history.

Navy in The National Poll

Navy has spent the entire season ranked in the nation's top 16, peaking at No. 10 in the preseason poll. Navy is currently ranked No. 11.

The Last Word

► Of Navy's 32 games this year, 18 of them will have come against ranked foes. The Mids enter the tournament with an 8-8 record. Broken down even further, Navy is 0-4 against teams ranked in the top 10, but 8-4 against teams ranked Nos. 11-20.

► **Cmdr. Tom Popp, USN**, was voted into the CWPA Hall of Fame and was honored at a banquet in Annapolis on Nov. 21. He is Navy's only member of the CWPA Hall of Fame.

► In the last five games entering the NCAA Tournament, **Michael Mulvey** has scored 26 points (13 g, 13 a), turning it on when Navy needed him the most.
