- Meeting for the second time this season, Navy (8-4) and Wake Forest (7-5) will battle one another on Saturday, Dec. 20 in the inaugural EagleBank Bowl.

- The EagleBank Bowl will be televised nationally by ESPN with Terry Gannon (play-by-play), David Norrie (analyst) and Quint Kessenich (sideline) calling the action from historic RFK Stadium (47,843) beginning at 11:00 a.m.

- The Navy Football Radio Network will provide more than six hours of coverage starting at 9:00 a.m. with its pregame show on 1430 WNAV (Annapolis) hosted by Pete Medhurst, Joe Miller and Wiley Baker.

- The Navy Football Pregame Show will get underway at 10:00 a.m. with Bob Socci, Omar Nelson, John Feinstein and Pete Medhurst setting the scene from the nation's capital, followed by game action beginning at 11:00 a.m. Sirius Satellite Radio will carry the Navy broadcast on a channel to be announced.

The Last Time ...

Navy 24, (16/15) Wake Forest 17

Sept. 27, 2008 | Winston-Salem, N.C.

• Navy's defense forced six Wake Forest turnovers (4 INT, 2 Fumbles), while fullback **Eric Kettani** (Kirtland, Ohio) rushed for a career-high 175 yards to lead Navy to a 24-17 upset over the 16th-ranked Demon Deacons. The win was Navy's first over a team ranked in both polls since defeating Virginia, 20-17, in 1985.

• Linebacker **Ross Pospisil** set the tone early by picking off Riley Skinner on the third play of the game. The Mids converted it into seven points as QB **Kaipo-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada** scored from four yards.

• After forcing Wake to punt on its next possession, Kaheaku-Enhada drove the Mids down the field on a 13-play, 74-yard drive capped off by his three-yard touchdown run to stretch the Mids' lead to 14-0.

• Navy nose guard **Ryan Griffith** stripped Wake Forest's Marshall Williams on its next possession nine yards downfield and was recovered by **Billy Yarborough**. On Wake's next possession, safety **Wyatt Middleton** picked off Skinner, giving the ball back to the Mids at the Wake Forest 27-yard line thanks to a 22-yard return by Middleton.

• On the ensuing drive, Kaheaku-Enhada pulled up with a hamstring injury on a draw one yard short of the first down on third-and-five from the Wake 27-yard line. **Matt Harmon** came on to drill a 35-yard field goal to give the Mids a 17-0 lead.

• Navy's 17-0 lead held at the half thanks to two more Wake Forest turnovers. Defensive end **Jabaree Tuani** forced a fumble that was recovered by **Ram Vela** and then on Wake's final possession corner **Ketric Buffin** picked off Skinner.

• **John Angelo** fumbled the ball on the opening kickoff and Wake Forest recovered the ball at the Navy 16-yard line. The Demon Deacons moved the ball down to the one-yard line where it took four plays to score.

• Wake Forest got the ball at the Navy 41-yard line and moved it down to the Navy one-yard line where they had first-and-goal. The Navy defense held strong, forcing Wake Forest to kick a field goal.

• Wake Forest was driving for the tying score, but safety **Emmett Merchant** stepped in front of a Skinner pass. On Navy's first offensive play, Kettani burst through the middle of the Wake Forest defense and rumbled 57 yards down to the Wake Forest six-yard line. Two plays later, Bryant scored from four yards out to make the score 24-10.

• The Deacs scored with 1:14 left on an eight-yard pass from Skinner to clip Navy's lead to 24-17, but Navy's **Corey Johnson (Sr. / Anderson, Ind.)** recovered the on-side kick to seal the victory for the Mids.

Head Coach Ken Niumatalolo

- Longtime Navy assistant head coach Ken Niumatalolo was promoted to head football coach Dec. 8, 2007, becoming the program's 38th head football coach.
- He is the second Polynesian head coach in NCAA Division IA history (Larry Price, head coach at Hawai'i, 1974-76, was the first) and the first Samoan collegiate head coach on any level.
- Niumatalolo has been an integral part of a staff that has brought the Midshipmen back into the national spotlight with a 51-24 (.680) record over the last six years. His work with the offense has helped the Mids lead the nation in rushing in five of the last six years, including each of the past four seasons, a first in NCAA history.

Niumatalolo Seeks First Commander-In-Chief's Trophy as Head Coach

- Thanks to a 33-27 victory over Air Force on Oct. 4, Ken Niumatalolo became the first Navy head coach to win his first service academy game since George Welsh in 1973 (Welsh beat Air Force, 42-6).
- Niumatalolo is also the first service academy coach to win a service academy game on the first try since Fisher DeBerry beat Navy, 29-22, in 1984.
- Directing Navy to a 34-0 shutout over Army, Niumatalolo became just the second service academy coach to win the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy in his first year, joining George Welsh, who, in 1973, led the Midshipmen to wins over Air Force (42-6) and Army (51-0).
- Navy is 8-3 when Niumatalolo has been on the sideline as either its head or assistant coach for the Army-Navy game with the Mids winning a series record seven in a row.
- He has felt both the joys of victory and the agony of defeat in the race for the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy (6-5). He lost four in a row as an assistant coach under Charlie Weatherbie from 1995-98. Since returning to the Academy in 2002, he is 6-1, claiming six straight, including his first as a head coach.

Niumatalolo Makes History

- With an 8-4 record, Ken Niumatalolo is just the third coach since World War II to lead Navy to a winning record in his first year at the helm. He joins Wayne Hardin (5-4-1 in 1959) and Gary Tranquill (6-5 in 1982) on the exclusive list.
- Niumatalolo's eight wins are tied for the fourth most by a first-year coach in school history. With a win over Wake Forest in the EagleBank Bowl, he would tie the school record with nine wins set by Joe Reeves (1907), Frank Berrien (1908) and Bill Ingram (1926).

Niumatalolo Wins CIC Trophy In First Year

- Ken Niumatalolo is just the second service academy coach to win the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy in his first year, joining George Welsh, who, in 1973, led the Midshipmen to wins over Air Force (42-6) and Army (51-0).

Six-Straight Winning Seasons

- Navy clinched its sixth-consecutive winning season with a 16-0 victory over Northern Illinois on Nov. 25.
- The six-straight winning seasons are the most by Navy since the Mids enjoyed 10-straight winning seasons from 1952-61.
- With a victory over Wake Forest in the EagleBank Bowl, the Mids would finish the 2008 season with a 9-4 record marking just the 12th time in school history and the third time in the last five years that Navy has recorded nine or more wins.

Scouting Wake Forest

- The Demon Deacons finished the regular season with a 7-5 record, capturing wins over Baylor (41-13), Mississippi (30-28), Florida State (12-3), Clemson (12-7), Duke (33-30, OT), Virginia (28-17) and Vanderbilt (23-10).
- In addition to Navy, the Deacs dropped decisions against Maryland (26-0), Miami (Fla.) (16-10), NC State (21-17) and Boston College (24-21).
- Wake Forest is ranked 100th nationally in rushing offense (111.6 yards per game), 84th in passing offense (188.7 ypg), 103rd in total offense (300.3 ypg) and 97th in scoring offense (20.3 points per game).
- Defensively, the Deacs are 21st in rushing defense (116.1 ypg), 28th in passing defense (184.3 ypg), 19th in total defense (300.3 ypg) and 17th in scoring defense (18.3 ppg).
- Cornerback Alphonso Smith, who was recently named to the American Football Coaches Association All-America Team, is tied for fifth in the country for interceptions per game (0.5 per contest).
- Five Wake Forest players garnered All-ACC accolades. Linebacker Aaron Curry and Smith were each first team selections, while wide receiver D.J. Boldin earned first-team honors on offense. Quarterback Riley Skinner and defensive tackle Boo Robinson were each honorable mention selections.

Navy Vs. The ACC

- The Midshipmen own a 104-86-5 (.546) all-time record against current members of the Atlantic Coast Conference.
- It was a split decision for the Mids in their two games against ACC teams this year, dropping a 41-31 decision to Duke before picking up a 24-17 win at Wake Forest two weeks later.
- Navy has faced an ACC team in 19 of the last 20 years, including each of the last five seasons.

Rare Rematch

- Familiar foes Navy and Wake Forest will meet for the second time this season when the two battle one another at the inaugural EagleBank Bowl. The Mids knocked off No. 15 Wake Forest, 21-17, on Sept. 27 in Winston-Salem.

- The Mids knocked off No. 15 Wake Forest, 21-17, on Sept. 27 in Winston-Salem, N.C.

It's the first time Navy has played an opponent twice in the same season since 1907 when Navy swept St. John's College, 26-0 and 12-0.

- It will be the fifth time in school history that Navy has played the same team twice and the first time it has played an opponent twice other than St. John's College. The Mids also played their crosstown rivals twice in 1888 (St. John's won 6-4 and 22-6), 1887 (Navy won 4-0 and 24-0) and in 1886 (Navy won 12-0 and lost 4-0).

Navy at RFK

- Navy owns a 2-1 record in games played at RFK Stadium, although the Mids have not played there since 1975. Navy defeated Pitt, 12-0, in 1965 and Air Force, 17-0, in 1975. The Mids lost to Air Force at RFK, 26-3, in 1970.

Recapping Last Year's Bowl Game

- Utah outscored Navy 21-0 over a seven-minute span at the end of the third quarter and beginning of the fourth quarter to rally for a 35-32 Poinsettia Bowl victory over the Midshipmen at Qualcomm Stadium in San Diego. The game was the debut for Navy head coach Ken Niumatalolo.

- Navy led 10-7 at the half, but could have led by more if not for missed opportunities. On the Mids' second drive of the game, **Reggie Campbell** fumbled on the Utah two-yard line and the ball was recovered by the Utes' Joe Jiannoni.

- Utah took a 7-0 lead in the second quarter on a five-yard TD run by Darrell Mack.

- The Mids answered Utah's score with one of their own, driving 70 yards in eight plays. Quarterback **Kaipo-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada (Kapolei, Hawaii'i)** capped the drive with a one-yard touchdown run to tie the score at seven.

- After the Navy defense forced Utah to go three-and-out on its next possession, the Mids took the ball over at their own 47. With 2:39 left in the half, they methodically drove 31 yards in 11 plays with Bullen capping the drive with a 39-yard field goal to give Navy a 10-7 halftime lead.

- Navy made it 17-7 on the first drive of the third quarter, moving 69 yards on four plays. Fullback **Eric Kettani (Kirtland, Ohio)** busted through the Utah secondary and rumbled 43 yards for a touchdown to give Navy a 17-7 lead.

- Navy had a chance to put the game away as the defense rose to the challenge and forced Utah to punt after just four plays. All-American punter Louie Sakoda pinned Navy back at its own eight-yard line. The Mids were unable to pick up a first down as Kaheaku-Enhada was held to two yards on a third-and-five run and Utah got the ball back on its own 41 after a punt by **Greg Veteto**.

- The Utes quickly moved down the field as wide receiver Jereme Brooks scored from 23 yards out off a reverse to cut Navy's lead to 17-14.

- Utah took the lead on its next drive, moving the ball 84 yards on just five plays. Four of the plays were passes, the last a 40-yard touchdown strike from Johnson to Derrek Richards to make the score 21-17.

- Utah forced a third-consecutive punt on Navy's next drive and the Utes took advantage by scoring a third-straight touchdown. Johnson's 19-yard quarterback draw gave Utah a 28-17 lead with 12:47 left in the contest.

- Kaheaku-Enhada led Navy on a nine-play, 81-yard drive that was capped off by a 10-yard touchdown pass to White that made the score 28-25.

- The Utes took the ensuing kickoff and drove down the field where on third-and-goal Johnson hit Brooks with a swing pass and Navy's **Ketric Buffin (Rowlett, Texas)** knocked the ball out of Brooks' hands. The fumble clearly hit the pylon, which should have given the ball to Navy at the 20-yard line. The officials missed the ball hitting the pylon and inexplicably the replay official did not overturn the call. After the game, the Mid-American Conference officials and replay official apologized to Navy for the error. The Mids held Utah on fourth down as **Rashawn King (Raleigh, N.C.)** and a host of other Mids stopped Mack on the one-yard line on fourth down.

- After picking up eight yards on the first three plays, the Mids went for it on fourth-and-two from their own nine. Utah's Joe Dale made a great play to stop Kaheaku-Enhada a yard short of the first down. The Utah offense scored on a Mack one-yard run and the Utes appeared to have an insurmountable 35-25 lead with 1:27 left.

- Kaheaku-Enhada hit **Zerbin Singleton** with a 58-yard TD pass that made the score 35-32 with 57 seconds left.

- Bullen pulled off a perfectly-executed outside kick that initially Utah's Dale had his hands on, but Singleton ripped it out of his hands giving the ball to Navy at its own 42 with 57 seconds left. Kaheaku-Enhada's pass was intercepted by Dale after Campbell slipped coming out of his route.

Mids Service Academy Dominance

- Thanks to a 34-0 shutout over Army, Navy claimed its 13th straight win over a service academy foe, establishing a new record for consecutive service academy wins.
- Navy's 13-game service academy winning streak dates back to the Army-Navy game in 2002 ... the Mids are outscoring the opposition 441-205 (33.9 - 15.8) during that 13-game winning streak.
- Earlier this year, Navy put itself in position to establish the record by defeating Air Force, 33-27, in Colorado Springs. The Falcons previously held the record, winning 12 in a row from 1997-2002.
- With wins over both Air Force and Army this season, Navy earned its sixth consecutive Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, tying the record for consecutive trophies won set by Air Force from 1998-02.
- The Mids own a 51-24 (.680) record over the last six years and have proven to be the dominant service academy team over that time span.

Navy Routs Army for Seventh-Straight Year

- Senior slot back **Shun White (Memphis, Tenn.)** and senior fullback **Eric Kettani (Kirtland, Ohio)** combined for 273 yards rushing and three touchdowns, while the Navy defense held the Army offense to 154 yards of total offense as Navy blasted Army for the seventh-straight year, 34-0, in front of a sold-out crowd of 69,144 at Lincoln Financial Field in Philadelphia.
- It was Navy's first shutout against Army since 1978.
- Navy jumped out to a 7-0 lead on the third play of the game when White rant 65 yards off an option pitch from quarterback **Kaipō-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada (Sr./Kapolei, Hawai'i)**.
- The Mids made it 10-0 on their third drive of the game when **Matt Harmon (Sr./Greenville, S.C.)** drilled a 23-yard field goal and went up 17-0 right before the half when Kaheaku-Enhada hit White with an 18-yard TD pass.
- Navy put the game away with a methodical drive to open the third quarter, marching 72 yards on 14 plays and taking 7:52 off the clock. Kettani ended the drive with a five-yard touchdown run and the rout was on.
- The Navy defense was superb all day, holding the Black Knights to just seven first downs.
- Fifty of Army's 154 yards of total offense came during mop up time in the fourth quarter.
- Navy's front three of **Nate Frazier (Jr./Atlanta, Ga.)**, **Matt Nechak (Jr./Canoga Park, Calif.)** and **Jabaree Tuani (Fr./Madison, Tenn.)** dominated the Army offensive line and created havoc all day for the Army offense. Frazier was second on the team in tackles with seven, while recording 1.5 tackles for a loss and deflecting a pass.
- Junior linebacker **Ross Pospisil (Temple, Texas)** led the Mids with 12 tackles and a forced fumble, while junior outside linebacker **Ram Vela (San Antonio, Texas)** had six tackles, a sack and intercepted Army quarterback Chip Bowden's pass and returned it 68 yards for a touchdown.
- Navy played the game with a heavy heart as it was without the services of senior cornerback **Rashawn King (Raleigh, N.C.)** who returned home to Raleigh, N.C. on Friday morning to be with his family after the sudden death of his father, Drexel, who suffered a heart attack Thursday night. In memory of Mr. King, the Navy football team wore a sticker on the back of its helmets with the initials DK inside of a black crown.

Senior Class Climbing Navy's Career Wins Leader Board

- Navy's senior class is one of the winningest classes in school history.
- Following back-to-back shutouts for the first time since 1986, the Class of '09 took stands fifth on the Navy's most wins by a class list with 33.

Forcing Turnovers

• Navy has come up with 29 turnovers (16 interceptions and 13 fumbles) in its 12 games this season.
 • Twenty-five of the Mids' 29 TOs have been amassed over the last eight games after forcing just 16 turnovers all of last year (13 games).
 • Navy junior outside linebacker **Ram Vela (San Antonio, Texas)** picked off Army QB Chip Bowden with 31 seconds remaining in the game and ran it back for a 68-yard TD. It was Navy's 16th interception, six more than last year's total.
 • The Mids, meanwhile, have produced seven more fumble recoveries than a year ago after sophomore safety **Wyatt Middleton (Norcross, Va.)** turned in his first collegiate fumble recovery in Navy's win over Army.
 • Forcing 29 turnovers, while turning the ball over 13 times, Navy is tied for third in turnover margin at +1.33.
 • Ironically, Navy is tied with Wake Forest in turnover margin. In the first meeting between the two teams, Navy forced six Demon Deacon TOs, while losing two fumbles.
 • The Mids are tied for 11th nationally in turnovers gained with 29.

King, Horne Selected to Leadership Positions Within Brigade

• Senior cornerback **Rashawn King (Raleigh, N.C.)** and senior linebacker **Alex Horne (Lexington, N.C.)** have been selected for leadership positions within the Brigade of Midshipmen for the second semester.
 • King, who has recorded 39 tackles and picked off a team-high tying three passes on the year, has been selected Chief of Staff for the Brigade of Midshipmen.
 • The Chief of Staff is responsible to the Brigade Commander for the efficient operation of the entire Brigade Staff. He plans and conducts Brigade staff meetings and supports the goals and policies of the Brigade Commander. His specific duties and responsibilities include working with the Brigade Executive Officer in support of the Brigade Commander, responsible for staff and policy issues concerning the members of Brigade Staff, maintains close contact with the Deputy Commandant and acts as an intermediary between the Brigade Staff and the Deputy Commandant's staff and fulfills the duties of the Brigade Commander in his/her absence if the Brigade Executive Officer is unavailable.
 • The Brigade Chief of Staff is the third highest-ranking Midshipman in the chain-of-command and reports to the Brigade Commander.
 • Horne, who is a reserve linebacker, will serve as the First Battalion Commander.
 • The Battalion Commander is responsible for the safety, well-being and efficiency of the Battalion. The Battalion Commander is also responsible for the general cleanliness, maintenance, and appearance of the Battalion area.
 • Each Battalion is composed of a Battalion Staff and five companies. Although the Battalion Commander is supported and advised by the Battalion Officer, the Battalion Commander assumes full responsibility for the Battalion and will lead the Battalion while ensuring the Commandant's and Brigade Commander's policies are instituted and upheld.

100-Yard Rushing Quarterbacks

- Navy quarterbacks have rushed over 100 yards 70 times, including a 125-yard performance by sophomore **Ricky Dobbs (Douglasville, Ga.)** in Navy's 16-0 win over Northern Illinois on Nov. 25.
- Ricky Dobbs (Douglasville, Ga.)** is just the sixth quarterback in program history to top 100 yards on the ground in making their first collegiate start.
- Only eight of the documented 70 100-yard ground gains occurred prior to 1990 ... QBs have eclipsed 100 yards 24 times over the last five years, each of those bowl eligible seasons (2008 to be determined).
- 27 of the 70 100-yard ground gains by quarterbacks have taken place since the beginning of 2002, also known as the Triple Option Era.

Mids Looking for Fourth-Straight Rushing Title

- In the last six years, the Mids have consistently been one of the top rushing teams in the country, never finishing lower than third.
- In 2003, the Mids led the nation in rushing, averaging a then school-record 323.2 yards per game.
- In 2005, Navy led the country in rushing for the second time in three years, averaging 318.7 yards per game.
- Navy finished the 2006 campaign averaging a nation's-best and then school-record 327 yards per game.
- The Mids rushed for a school-record 348.8 yards per game in 2007, becoming the first team in NCAA history to lead the nation in rushing three-consecutive years.
- The 348.8 yards per game are the most yards rushing by a FBS team since Nebraska averaged 349.3 yards per game in 2000.
- Heading into the EagleBank Bowl, Navy is the nation's leading rushing team, averaging 298.3 yards. The Mids are 83 yards ahead of second-place Nevada, 242 yards ahead of Georgia Tech, 296 yards ahead of Oregon and 403 yards ahead of Air Force.

First Slot Back to 1,000 Yards

- Behind his 11-yard gain at 11:07 in the third quarter of the Army game, senior **Shun White (Memphis, Tenn.)** became the first slot back in program history to rush for 1,000 yards in a single season.
- Additionally, he is the first Navy player to run for 1,000 yards since fullback Kyle Eckel in 2004 (1,147 yards).
- White, who has 1,021 yards on the season, is just 26 yards from passing Cleveland Cooper for 10th on Navy's single-season rushing list and needs just 92 yards to pass Craig Candeto for ninth on the list. White is 128 yards away from bypassing Kyle Eckel for eighth on the list.
- Senior fullback **Eric Kettani (Kirtland, Ohio)** is just 68 yards short of 1,000 yards.
- If Kettani reaches that mark, it will be the first time in school history that Navy has produced two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season.

White and Kettani Become Navy's First 2,000-Yard Tandem

- For the first time in school history, Navy has produced two 2,000-yard rushers out of the same backfield.
- Not only did senior slot back **Shun White (Sr. / Memphis, Tenn.)** score Navy's first touchdown of the game against SMU, his 23-yard TD run also pushed him over the 2,000-yard mark.
- Finishing the game with 49 yards, he became just the eighth player in school history to reach 2,000 yards on the ground.
- With his 125-yard performance in Navy's 34-0 shutout over Army, senior fullback **Eric Kettani (Kirtland, Ohio)** became the ninth player in school history to rush for over 2,000 yards in his career.
- White jumped from eighth to sixth following his 13-carry, 148-yard performance against Army that gained him the Philadelphia Sports Writers Association MVP Award.
- With 2,240 yards, he will likely end his career sixth on the rushing leader board as he trails fifth-ranked Cleveland Cooper by 342 yards.
- Kettani, who has amassed 2,041 yards, needs just 84 yards to pass former teammate Adam Ballard for ninth on the Mids' all-time rushing list.

White Enjoying Productive Season

• Slot back **Shun White (Sr. / Memphis, Tenn.)** rushed for a school-record 348 yards and a career-high three touchdowns on 19 carries (18.3 yards per carry) in Navy's 41-13 rout of Towson in the Mids' opener. For his efforts, he was named the National Offensive Player of the Week by the Walter Camp Football Foundation.

• White is the first Navy player to rush for 300 yards in a game and is the 80th player in NCAA FBS (Football Bowl Subdivision) history to bust the 300-yard plateau.

• He rushed for 214 yards on 11 carries in the first half.

• Additionally, his 348 yards go down as a school record for all-purpose yardage and total offense per play (18.3 yards per play).

• White's rushing mark ranks 17th on the NCAA's all-time single-game rushing list and it's the most rushing yards by a player from the FBS since Northern Illinois' Garrett Wolfe rushed for 353 yards against Ball State on Sept. 30, 2006.

• White's 87-yard touchdown run in the second quarter vs. Towson was the fourth longest in school history and the longest since Pat McGrew ran for a 91-yard touchdown against Kent State on Nov. 22, 1997. It is also tied as the seventh-longest run in the country this season.

• White, who owns three of the 47-longest runs in the country this year, heads into the EagleBank Bowl tied for 45th in rushing averaging 85.1 yards per game.

• Additionally, White is ranked No. 2 nationally in average yards per carry (8.65).

Kaipō Finds the End Zone

• Quarterback **Kaipō-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada (Sr. / Kapolei, Hawai'i)** had scored a rushing touchdown in eight-consecutive games before failing to score a rushing touchdown in Navy's 46-44 triple overtime win over Notre Dame a year ago (though he did run in a key two-point conversion).

• His streak was the longest by a Navy player since Brian Madden scored in eight-straight games at the end of the 1999 season and the start of the 2001 season (Madden missed the entire 2000 campaign with a knee injury). Kaheaku-Enhada was just one off the school record of nine-straight games with a rushing touchdown set by Chris McCoy during the 1996-97 seasons.

• Kaheaku-Enhada has been responsible for 246 points in his career (25 rushing touchdowns and 16 passing touchdowns), the third most in school history.

Kaipō Fourth on Career Touchdowns List

• Quarterback **Kaipō-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada (Sr. / Kapolei, Hawai'i)** pushed his career rushing touchdown total to 25 after scoring a two-yard TD on the Mids' opening drive against Temple on Senior Day in Annapolis.

• The touchdown puts in him in a tie for fourth on Navy's touchdown list alongside former teammate Kyle Eckel.

• He needs six touchdowns to tie Napoleon McCallum for third on the list.

Kaipō Among Navy's Top 100-Yard Rushing QBs

• Quarterback **Kaipō-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada (Sr. / Kapolei, Hawai'i)** topped the 100-yard rushing mark for the sixth time in his career when he rushed for 122 yards and a touchdown against Pitt last fall.

• His six 100-yard rushing days are tied for the fourth most by a Navy quarterback in school history.

Kaipō on the Mark with Passing Game

• Quarterback **Kaipō-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada (Sr. / Kapolei, Hawai'i)** is averaging 9.2 yards per pass attempt in his career (1,609 yards on 175 attempts), which is the second-best average in school history.

• He is averaging a school-record tying 17.1 yards per completion in his career (94 completions for 1,609 yards).

• Additionally, he is averaging 5.9 yards of total offense per play (3,166 yards on 534 plays) in his career which is tied with Chris McCoy for the second-best average in program history behind Lamar Owens, who averaged 6.0 yards per play.

• Navy is 38-10 (.792) over the last seven years when rushing for 300-plus yards as a team.

Navy's Top 50 Rushing Games

- Navy opened the 2008 campaign by producing 558 yards in its ground attack against Towson, the third-most yards in program history.
- Sophomore quarterback **Ricky Dobbs** anchored a 404-yard rushing performance by the Mids in their 35-7 win over SMU on Oct. 25. Dobbs is the second Navy player this season to top 200 yards on the ground, joining **Shun White** who rushed for a school-record 348 yards against Towson.
- Navy's 572 yards against North Texas a year ago set a new school record for rushing yards in a game.
- Head coach Ken Niumatalolo was on the Navy staff as either an assistant or head coach for 10 of the 11 top-10 rushing marks (tie for 10th), including each of the top six.

Navy's Magic Man

- Sophomore quarterback **Ricky Dobbs (Douglasville, Ga.)** was a magician for the Mids over a four-game stretch at the end of the season.
- He rushed for 224 yards and four touchdowns on 42 carries in Navy's 34-7 victory over SMU.
- He is the first Navy quarterback to rush for over 200 yards in a game since Brian Madden carried the ball 33 times for 201 yards against Tulane on Nov. 10, 2001.
- He is only the fifth different quarterback in school history to top 200 yards rushing, joining Madden, Brian Broadwater, Chris McCoy (five times) and Alton Grizzard.
- His 224 yards rushing are the 12th most in school history and the fourth most by a quarterback.
- It is also the 16th most in the FBS this season, including the second most by a quarterback (Colin Kaepernick of Nevada rushed for 240 yards against UNLV).
- His four rushing TDs are tied for the second most in Navy history, while the 42 carries are tied as the third most.
- Dobbs followed up with an even more impressive performance, rallying Navy from 20 points down in the fourth quarter for a 33-27 overtime victory over Temple.
- Dobbs, who replaced starting QB **Kaipo-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada (Kapolei, Hawai'i)** late in the third quarter, threw a 22-yard touchdown pass to senior wide receiver **T.J. Thiel (Plymouth, Minn.)**.
- Additionally, he flipped the ball to senior fullback **Eric Kettani (Kirtland, Ohio)** on an option pitch on fourth-and-goal from the one yard line with three guys draped all over him to allow the Mids to pull within seven.
- He then scored the game-winning touchdown in overtime from one yard out.
- Dobbs rushed for 47 yards and one touchdown on 13 carries and completed five of his six pass attempts for 87 yards and one touchdown with one interception.
- He nearly outdid himself the following game against Notre Dame in front of a national audience. Trailing 27-7 with 2:30 left in the contest, Dobbs led the Mids on a four-play 57-yard touchdown drive capped off by a 24-yard TD run by **Shun White (Sr. / Memphis, Tenn.)** with 1:39 left.
- Navy senior kicker **Matt Harmon's (Greenville, S.C.)** onside kick attempt was illegally batted forward, costing the Irish 15 yards and allowing Navy a second onside kick attempt. This time, the kick was perfect and, after sophomore **Travis Simmons (Goldsby, Okla.)** took out the Notre Dame player trying to field the kick, senior **Corey Johnson (Anderson, Ind.)** fell on the ball at the Irish 41-yard line.
- On the first play from scrimmage, Dobbs threw a perfect strike to senior receiver **Tyree Barnes (Hampton, Va.)**, who made a spectacular catch at the Notre Dame one-yard line. Two plays later, Dobbs scored from the one to pull the Mids within a touchdown at 27-20. Harmon made the extra-point and when Notre Dame roughed the kicker, it allowed Navy to kickoff from the 45.
- Once again Harmon's onside kick was perfect, once again Simmons blew up the first line of Notre Dame's hands team and once against Johnson recovered the onside kick at the Irish 41-yard line with 1:21 left.
- After Dobbs ran for seven yards on first down, he threw a pass to a wide-open White at the Notre Dame 11-yard line that he just missed completing.
- Dobbs ran for three yards and a first down on the next play and then Navy intentionally spiked the ball to stop the clock with 39 seconds left.
- Dobbs was sacked on second down, forcing Navy to use its final timeout with 33 seconds left.
- On third down, Dobbs threw a jump ball to Barnes near the goal line that Navy just missed completing and then on fourth down Dobbs' pass sailed over the head of junior slot back **Cory Finnerty (Ventura, Calif.)** to end the game.
- Dobbs received his first-collegiate starting nod on Nov. 25 against Northern Illinois, where he promptly rushed for 124 yards and a touchdown on 25 carries.
- He is just the sixth QB in program history to rush for 100 yards in his first-career start, joining Brian Hampton (2006), Lamar Owens (2005), Brian Madden (1999), Brian Broadwater (1998) and Chris McCoy (1995).

Passing On the Pass

- Navy tied a school record with 77 rush attempts (vs. Delaware in 1996) in the 34-7 victory over SMU.
- Even more remarkable, the Mids did not throw a pass in a game for the first time in more than 60 years (game totals date back to 1948)
- Navy is the first team in the FBS to not throw a pass in a game since Ohio ran the ball 61 times and did not attempt a pass on Oct. 25, 1997, in a 21-17 victory over Akron.
- All three Service Academies won a game this year without completing a pass. Air Force defeated Houston despite going 0-7 through the air and Army beat Eastern Michigan despite going 0-3 through the air.

500 Yards of Offense

- Navy has topped the 500-yard mark 45 times, the 600-yard mark 14 times and the 700-yard mark once in school history.
- The Mids piled up 602 yards of total offense against Towson in their season opener.
- Navy has turned a 600-yard game in each of the last seven years beginning with its 678 yards against Northwestern in 2002.
- The 680-yard effort against North Texas on Nov. 10, 2007, was the second-best effort in school history.

Starting Streaks

- Wide receiver **Tyree Barnes (Sr. / Hampton, Va.)**, offensive guard **Anthony Gaskins (West Orange, N.J.)** and nose guard **Nate Frazier (Atlanta, Ga.)** have made starting appearances in each of the last 25 contests.
- In Navy's 34-0 victory over Army, junior slot back **Bobby Doyle (Chardon, Ohio)** made his first collegiate start.

Defensive Line Stepping Up

- Navy's front three on defense - junior defensive end **Matt Nechak (Canoga Park, Calif.)**, junior nose guard **Nate Frazier (Atlanta, Ga.)** and freshman defensive end **Jabaree Tuani (Madison, Tenn.)** - are having an impressive 2008 campaign.
- Tuani leads all down linemen with 39 tackles, has turned in a team-high 9.0 tackles for a loss and 1.5 sacks.
- Frazier has been in on 37 tackles, is third on the team with 8.0 tackles for a loss, has recorded a sack, an interception, broke up a pass, has forced and recovered a fumble.
- Nechak has recorded 35 tackles, is second on the team in tackles for a loss with 8.5 tackles, has recorded a team-high four sacks and has recovered one fumble.

Tuani Freshman All-America Candidate

- Defensive end **Jabaree Tuani (Madison, Tenn.)** has emerged as a candidate for Freshman All-America honors over the last several games.
- Tuani, who did not make his first-career start until the fifth game of the season, leads Navy's defensive line with 39 tackles, has recorded a team-high 9.0 tackles for a loss, has 1.5 sacks, recovered a fumble and forced three fumbles.
- He has played his best games against the Mids' toughest opponents, recording six tackles, including two tackles for a loss, and a forced fumble against Wake Forest, a career-high 10 tackles and a forced fumble against Air Force and seven stops, including two tackles for a loss, against Notre Dame.
- Tuani also forced a fumble against Pittsburgh.

Stopping the Run

- Navy has held three of its opponents this year to under 50 yards rushing in a game.
- SMU was held to -13 yards on 11 carries in Navy's 34-7 victory, the Mids held Towson to just 30 yards rushing on 26 carries in Navy's 41-13 rout of the Tigers and Navy held Wake Forest to 43 yards on 31 carries in Navy's 24-17 victory over the then 16th-ranked Demon Deacons.
- The Mids are ranked 31st in the country in run defense, allowing just 126.2 yards per game.

Navy Vs. Ranked Opponents

- Navy's 24-17 victory over No. 16 Wake Forest on Sept. 27 was its first win over a ranked opponent since Oct. 4, 2003, when Navy beat Air Force, 28-25 at FedExField in Landover, Md. The Falcons were ranked No. 25 in the Coaches Poll.
- It's the Mids' first win over a team ranked in BOTH polls since 1985 when the Mids upset Virginia who was No. 20 in the *Associated Press* Poll and 17th in the Coaches Poll.
- Wake Forest is the highest ranked team Navy has defeated since stunning No. 2 South Carolina at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium in 1984.
- Navy's last win over a ranked team in the *Associated Press* Top 25 was on Sept. 28, 1985, when the Mids upset No. 20 Virginia, 17-13.
- It's Navy's first win over a ranked team on the road since beating Virginia, 20-17, on Sept. 28, 1985, in Charlottesville.
- Navy has beaten just two ranked teams in the last 20 years, six in the last 30 years and 10 in the last 40 years.
- Navy has not beaten more than one ranked team in a season since 1957, when it defeated No. 5 Notre Dame (20-6), No. 10 Army (27-20) and No. 8 Rice (20-7) in the Cotton Bowl.

Enough to Win

- The 16 points scored by Navy against Northern Illinois are the fewest points the Mids have scored in a win since Oct. 23, 2004, when Navy beat Rice, 14-13.

Defense Has a Day to Remember

- Wake Forest entered its game against the Mids ranked No. 1 in turnover margin, but the Navy defense turned the tables on the Demon Deacons forcing six turnovers.
- It was the first time Navy has forced six turnovers in a game since 2003 when the Mids forced six against Eastern Michigan. It is also the first time the Navy defense picked off four passes in a game since that same game against Eastern Michigan.
- Considering the quality of opposition, its performance against the Deacs is the best by a Navy defensive unit since 1985 when an 0-3 Navy team went in to Charlottesville and upset 20th-ranked Virginia, 17-13.

Defense Shuts Down SMU

- Although **Ricky Dobbs (So./Douglasville, Ga.)** grabbed most of the media's attention, it was the performance of the Navy defense that was the key to the Mids 34-7 victory over SMU.
- Navy held SMU to 144 yards of total offense, including -13 yards on the ground on 11 carries.
- The -13 yards rushing are the fewest rushing yards allowed by the Navy defense since Oct. 28, 1978, when Navy held Pitt to -28 yards rushing in a 21-11 victory over the Panthers.
- Ironically, the majority of that '78 defense was in the stands watching Saturday's game as that team was honored at halftime for their victory over BYU in the Holiday Bowl.
- The 144 yards of total offense by SMU are the fewest against Navy since the Mids held Army to 87 yards on Dec. 8, 1997, in a 39-7 victory.
- The eight SMU first downs are the fewest since that same Army-Navy game (1997) when Army managed just three.

All-America Candidate and Lou Groza Award Semifinalist Matt Harmon

- Senior kicker **Matt Harmon (Greenville, S.C.)**, who has twice been named a Lou Groza "Star of the Week" this season (following the Rutgers and Air Force games) was named a semifinalist for the Lou Groza Award Oct. 27.
- While Harmon is an All-America candidate, Navy has never had a kicker named a First-Team All-American.
- Harmon has made 17 of his 19 field goals on the year (.895), with one of his two misses blocked (Temple).
- His streak of 13 in a row dating back to the Mids' opener against Towson was snapped by Temple when it blocked his 37-yarder at the end of the first half.
- He is 14-of-15 inside of 40 yards.
- His 17 field goals this season are tied as the second most in school history, while his 31-career field goals are also the second most.
- His four field goals against Air Force tied a school record, accomplished five other times. It marked the first time a Navy player has made four field goals since 1999 when Tim Shubzda nailed four against Army.
- Additionally, Harmon has made 90 of the 93 (.968) extra points he has taken during his career, including 37-of-39 (.949) this season.
- He became Navy's consecutive PATs made record holder after connecting on all five extra-points in Navy's opener against Towson (52) ... he pushed his streak to 70 in a row by the SMU game, but hit the upright on his second try against the Mustangs to snap his string.
- He moved past Bob Tata (1976-78) into third on the career PATs made list after kicking three extra points at Air Force. With 86 PATs, he trails second-place Tom Vanderhorst (1995-98) by three.
- He moved past former teammate Tom Vanderhorst (1995-98) and into second on the career points by a kicker list after making a pair of field goals (23, 36) and four PATs in Navy's 34-0 victory over Army. He owns 183 points and trails record holder Steve Fehr (1979-81) by just nine points.

Playing in the Big Time

- Since the start of the 2003 season, Navy has played 20 games in 11 different big league stadiums (10 NFL and one MLB), posting an 12-8 record (.600).
- No college team in the country has played in more NFL stadiums than Navy over the last five years.
- The Mids played Notre Dame at Baltimore's M&T Bank Stadium on Nov. 15 and shut out archrival Army at Philadelphia's Lincoln Financial Field on Dec. 6.

Historical Comeback

- Navy's 20-point, fourth-quarter rally to defeat Temple was the largest fourth-quarter comeback in school history.
- It was also Navy's first come-from-behind win by double digits since erasing an 18-point second quarter deficit to beat North Texas, 74-62, on Nov. 10, 2007.
- It was Navy's first come-from-behind win by double-digits in the second half since Sept. 22, 2007, when Navy trailed Duke, 43-32, in the fourth quarter before coming back to win, 46-43.
- Navy nearly pulled off an even bigger comeback a week later against Notre Dame. Trailing 27-7 with 2:39 remaining in the contest, Navy scored two quick touchdowns and got the ball back, driving for the game-winning score before losing the ball on downs.

Epic Drives

- Navy's nine-play, 94-yard scoring drive against Rutgers that ended in a two-yard touchdown run by fullback **Eric Kettani (Sr. / Kirtland, Ohio)** with 4:01 left in the third quarter was the longest scoring drive by Navy in yards since the epic Emerald Bowl drive on Dec. 30, 2004.
- Navy drove 94 yards on an NCAA-record 22 plays in an NCAA record 14:34 seconds against New Mexico en route to a 34-19 win.
- Navy's 19-play, 81-yard drive for a field goal on the opening drive of the game against Northern Illinois was the longest scoring drive (# of plays) for Navy since that same Emerald Bowl drive.

Navy Sets Turnstile Record ... Again!

- For the fourth-consecutive year, the Naval Academy Athletic Association has set a school record for season tickets sold. There have been over 23,000 season tickets sold this season.
- The previous record was 22,634 season tickets, which was set last year.
- Over the past six years, Navy has increased football season ticket sales by more than 150 percent.

• "We appreciate the incredible enthusiasm the CBS family continues to display toward our nation's number one college football rivalry," said Gladchuk. "Knowing that a worldwide audience will now enjoy this event on a day exclusively dedicated to Army and Navy makes this game the focal point for all of college football."

• "We could not be more pleased to announce that America's Game will be broadcast to a worldwide audience by CBS Sports for the next decade. CBS has proven to be an excellent partner for the Academies over the years and continues to share in our reverence for this time-honored rivalry," said Anderson. "We feel very fortunate that this great American tradition will continue to be delivered to servicemen around the globe with the care and respect that the leadership at CBS Sports provides."

• The game also will be streamed live and free-of-charge on CBSSports.com, reaching the servicemen and women around the world.

• Each year during the new deal, CBS Sports will present a special edition of its pregame show, COLLEGE FOOTBALL TODAY, dedicated to the game and will feature the traditional parade of the Brigade of Midshipmen and the Corps of Cadets onto the field.

• CBS Sports and CBS College Sports Network recently announced a long-term agreement with Navy to broadcast home college football and basketball games and Olympic sports.

• The announcement was made by Mike Aresco, Executive Vice President, Programming, CBS Sports, Steve Herbst, Executive Vice President and General Manager, CBS College Sports Network and Chet Gladchuk, Athletic Director, United States Naval Academy.

• CBS Sports agreed to a long-term deal with Navy to broadcast the Notre Dame-Navy game, which will broadcast the games hosted by Navy through 2016, with an option for 2018. The deal begins with the 2010 game.

• CBS College Sports Network extended its agreement with Navy to serve as the exclusive broadcast partner for Navy home football and various neutral site games through the 2017-18 season. In addition, CBS College Sports Network will broadcast various men's basketball games, lacrosse games and Olympic sports. All football games will be broadcast in high definition. The network initially signed on as Navy's television and multimedia partner in 2005.

• In the new agreement, CBS College Sports Network will continue to operate NavySports.com, the official athletic website for Navy.

• During the length of the agreement, CBS College Sports Network will broadcast notable match-ups including games against Wake Forest; Air Force; East Carolina; Ohio State; Pitt; Rutgers; TCU; Northwestern; Duke; Ole Miss and Syracuse.

Mids Hold Block Party In Colorado Springs

• Slot back **Greg Shinego (Sr. / Port St. Lucie, Fla.)** blocked a punt by Air Force's Ryan Harrison in the first quarter and the ball was picked up by **Blake Carter (Jr. / Stillwater, Okla.)** and returned 25 yards for a touchdown.

• It was Navy's first blocked punt returned for a touchdown since Shaka Martin blocked a punt against Tulane and Gino Marchetti returned it 10 yards for a touchdown on Nov. 13, 1999.

• In the fourth quarter of the Air Force game, Carter blocked Harrison's punt and it was recovered in the end zone for a touchdown by **Bobby Doyle (Jr. / Chardon, Ohio)**.

• It is the first time in school history that Navy has blocked two punts for a touchdown in a single game and it also tied an NCAA record held by several schools.

Head Coach Ken Niumatalolo

First Season at Navy (8-5) • First Season as a Head Coach (8-5) • Hawai'i '89

Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk promoted longtime Navy assistant head coach Ken Niumatalolo to head football coach at the Naval Academy on Dec. 8, 2007. Niumatalolo, age 42, is the 38th head football coach in Naval Academy history. He is believed to be the second Polynesian head coach in NCAA Division IA history and the first Samoan collegiate head coach on any level.

"I have observed our program over the past six years and I attribute a large part of our success to

the invaluable role Ken has played as the assistant head coach," said Gladchuk. "A consummate professional and unquestioned role model for our players, he has led on many fronts with impeccable loyalty and character. Ken brings us quality continuity with the highest level of expertise in the triple option. Our staff is extremely excited about the promotion and are anxious to support our new head coach in a manner that will continue to reinforce our "Expect to Win" attitude at Navy."

"It's an honor and a privilege to be named head football coach at the Naval Academy," said Niumatalolo. "I would like to thank Adm. Fowler and Mr. Gladchuk for supporting me and I am excited about the future of the Navy football program."

Niumatalolo has had one of the most successful first seasons as a head coach in school history, becoming the first coach to lead Navy to a bowl game in his inaugural season and, thanks to a 33-27 victory over Air Force and a 34-0 win over Army, Niumatalolo became just the second Service Academy coach to win the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy in his first year.

Before being named head coach, Niumatalolo had two coaching stints at the Naval Academy for a combined 10 seasons, including the last six where he served as assistant head coach and offensive line coach.

Niumatalolo is part of a staff that has brought the Midshipmen back into the national spotlight with a 51-23 (.689) record over the last six seasons that includes a school record six-consecutive bowl game appearances. Niumatalolo's work with the offense has helped the Mids lead the nation in rushing in four of the last five years, including each of the past three seasons, a first in NCAA history.

The 2007 season was one for the record books as the Midshipmen posted an 8-5 record, won a school-record fifth-consecutive Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, appeared in a school-record fifth-straight bowl game (Poinsettia Bowl, which was Niumatalolo's first game as a head coach), became the first team in NCAA history to lead the nation in rushing three-consecutive years (rushing for a school-record 348.8 yards per contest) and defeated Notre Dame for the first time since 1963.

In 2006, Navy averaged a then school-record 327.0 yards per contest. One of

Niumatalolo's pupils, Antron Harper, was named to the ESPN.Com All-Bowl Team for the second-straight year as the Mids played in the Meineke Car Care Bowl against Boston College.

Niumatalolo helped develop an offensive line that, despite having just one returning starter, paved the way for the nation's best rushing offense (318.7 yards per contest) in 2005 as Navy went to a bowl game for a third-straight year, won a second-straight bowl game and won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy.

In 2004, Niumatalolo's efforts helped an offensive line that was hampered by injuries all year to perform well enough for the Midshipmen to finish third in the country in rushing (289.5), win a school-record tying 10 games (the most wins since 1905), go to back-to-back bowl games for the second time in school history, win the Emerald Bowl and win the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy.

Navy's offensive line was instrumental in the NCAA-record 26-play, 94-yard, 14:26 epic drive in the 2004 Emerald Bowl. Offensive guard August Roitsch was named to the Sports Illustrated All-Bowl Team, while the entire starting offensive line was selected to the College Football News All-Bowl Team.

Despite a lack of experience up front, the Mids led the nation in rushing (323.2 yards per contest) in 2003 and set seven school records as Navy went 8-5, won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy and earned a berth in the Houston Bowl.

In 2002, the Navy offensive line helped the Mids to the third-best rushing average in the country (270.75).

Niumatalolo was also an assistant at Navy from 1995-98, serving as the offensive coordinator in 1997 and 1998.

As the offensive coordinator, Niumatalolo tutored Chris McCoy, who set the then-NCAA record for most rushing touchdowns by a quarterback in a season with 20 in 1997 and became just the 10th player in NCAA history to rush for more than 1,000 yards and pass for more than 1,000 yards in the same season. In addition, Navy finished among the nation's top five in rushing his last-two years and broke 38 school offensive records during his tenure.

Niumatalolo coached at UNLV for three seasons (1999-01) where he coordinated the option game for the Rebels and called the plays. He also worked with the kickoff return unit and under his guidance, UNLV ranked sixth in the nation in kickoff returns in 2001 and finished second in 1999.

A 1989 graduate of Hawai'i, Niumatalolo lettered three years as a quarterback and led the Rainbows to their first postseason bowl appearance in 1989. He was hired as a full-time assistant by his alma mater in 1992 and spent three seasons coaching on the offensive side of the ball.





• Navy answered by marching down to the Ball State 12-yard line. On first down, Bryant kept for two yards and on second down Bryant kept again for two yards. On third-and-six from the Ball State eight-yard line, White took a pitch from Bryant down to the three yard-line. Navy went for it on fourth-and-one, but Bryant was stonewalled at the line of scrimmage by the Ball State defense and the Cardinals took over on downs.

- **Matt Harmon's (Sr. / Greenville, S.C.)** 24-yard field goal with 2:06 remaining gave Navy a 23-21 lead and **Ross Pospisil's (Sr. / Temple, Texas)** interception two plays later put the game away, as the Midshipmen rallied for a thrilling 23-21 victory over Rutgers in front of a stadium-record crowd of 37,821 fans.
- Tailing 14-6, Navy managed just 109 yards of total offense in the opening half. The score could have been worse if not for the brilliant play by safety **Wyatt Middleton (So. / Norcross, Ga.)**, who stripped wide receiver Tiquan Underwood of the ball at the Navy four-yard line with 20 seconds remaining in the half. The fumble was recovered by safety **Emmett Merchant (So. / Riverdale, Ga.)** in the end zone for a touch-back.
- Navy took to the air to start the second half with **Kaipo-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada (Sr. / Kapolei, Hawaii)** completing three of four passes for 77 yards and a touchdown on the opening drive. The biggest pass play of the drive was the first one as the Mids were facing a third-and-seven on their own 21-yard line. Despite being under duress, Kaheaku-Enhada threw a perfect strike to wide receiver **Tyree Barnes (Sr. / Hampton, Va.)**, who made a spectacular catch with two defenders on him. • Navy's defense forced six Wake Forest turnovers, while fullback **Eric Kettani (Sr. / Kirtland, Ohio)** rushed for a career-high 175 yards to lead Navy to a 24-17 upset over the 16th-ranked Demon Deacons. The win was Navy's first over a team ranked in both polls since defeating Virginia, 20-17, in 1985.

• The defense was spectacular all game, picking off the QB four times and recovering two fumbles. Linebacker **Ross Pospisil (Jr. / Temple, Texas)** set the tone early by picking off Riley Skinner on the third play of the game. The Mids converted it into seven points as QB **Kaipo-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada (Sr. / Kapolei, Hawaii)** scored from four yards out to cap an eight-play drive.

• After forcing Wake to punt on its next possession, Kaheaku-Enhada drove the Mids down the field on a 13-play, 74-yard drive capped off by his three-yard touchdown run to stretch the Mids' lead to 14-0. The big play on the drive was a 39-yard pass from Kaheaku-Enhada to **Tyree Barnes (Sr. / Hampton, Va.)** on third-and-17 that allowed the Mids to overcome a chop block call by the umpire.

• Navy nose guard **Ryan Griffith (Sr. / Columbia, Md.)** stripped Wake Forest's Marshall Williams on its next possession nine yards downfield and was recovered by **Billy Yarborough (So. / Columbia, S.C.)**.

• On Wake's next possession, safety **Wyatt Middleton (So. / Norcross, Ga.)** picked off Skinner, giving the ball back to the Mids at the Wake Forest 27-yard line thanks to a 22-yard return by Middleton.

• On the ensuing drive, Kaheaku-Enhada pulled up with a hamstring injury on a quarterback draw one yard short of the first down on third-and-five from the Wake 27-yard line. Kicker **Matt Harmon (Sr. / Greenville, S.C.)** came on to drill a 35-yard field goal to give the Mids a 17-0 lead.

• Navy's 17-0 lead held at the half thanks to two more Wake Forest turnovers. Defensive end **Jabaree Tuani (Fr. / Madison, Tenn.)** forced a fumble that was recovered by **Ram Vela (Jr./San Antonio, Texas)** and then on Wake's final possession corner **Ketric Buffin (Sr. / Rowlett, Texas)** picked off Skinner.

• **John Angelo (So. / Newport Beach, Calif.)** fumbled the ball on the opening kickoff after being knocked unconscious from a helmet-to-helmet blow. Wake Forest recovered Angelo's fumble at the Navy 16-yard line. The Demon Deacons moved the ball down to the one-yard line where it took four plays to score.

• Wake Forest got the ball at the Navy 41-yard line and moved it down to the Navy one-yard line where they had first-and-goal. The Navy defense held strong, forcing Wake Forest to kick a field goal.

• Wake Forest was driving for the tying score, but safety **Emmett Merchant (So. / Rivardale, Ga.)** stepped in front of a Skinner pass. On Navy's first offensive play, Kettani burst through the middle of the Wake Forest defense and rumbled 57 yards down to the Wake Forest six-yard line. Two plays later, Bryant scored from four yards out to make the score 24-10.

• The Deacs scored with 1:14 left on an eight-yard pass from Skinner to clip Navy's lead to 24-17, but Navy's **Corey Johnson (Sr. / Anderson, Ind.)** recovered the on-side kick to seal the victory for the Mids.

• Cornerback **Blake Carter (Jr. / Stillwater, Okla.)** picked up a blocked punt by **Greg Shinego (Sr. / Port St. Lucie, Fla.)** and ran 25 yards for a touchdown in the first quarter and then blocked a punt of his own that **Bobby Doyle (Jr. / Chardon, Ohio)** fell on in the back of the end zone for a touchdown that gave Navy a 33-20 fourth quarter lead as the Midshipmen went on to score a 33-27 victory before 46,339 at Falcon Stadium in Colorado Springs. The win was the sixth straight by Navy over Air Force.

• Navy's special teams dominated play all day as kicker **Matt Harmon (Sr. / Greenville, S.C.)** tied a school record by drilling four field goals, meanwhile the kickoff team pinned Air Force inside the 10-yard line on the opening kickoff of the third period, setting up Navy's only offensive touchdown of the day.

• In the second quarter, Air Force got the ball down to the one-yard line, but on third down Air Force quarterback Shea Smith was stopped by defensive end **Jabaree Tuani (Fr. / Madison, Tenn.)** for no gain and on fourth down junior **Ram Vela (San Antonio, Texas)** stuffed Ty Paffett for a loss of one yard, thwarting the Air Force threat.

• In the third quarter, after Navy had taken a 23-20 lead on a 44-yard field goal by Harmon, the defense stopped Smith on a fourth-and-three play as Pospisil tripped up Smith at the 35-yard line, one yard short of the first down marker.

• After a Navy punt, safety **Wyatt Middleton (So. / Norcross, Ga.)** caused a fumble on the next play as he put a textbook hit on Air Force running back Savier Stephens, hitting the ball with his helmet and causing it to pop up in the air. The fumble was grabbed by **Matt Nechak (Jr. / Canoga, Calif.)**. Four plays later, Harmon made his fourth field goal of the day, this one from 32 yards out.

• Carter then blocked the punt on Air Force's next possession to put the game away.

• Quarterback **Jared Bryant (Sr. / Hoover, Ala.)** led the Navy offense with 101 yards and one touchdown on 24 carries. He completed one of his two pass attempts, a 38-yarder to **Shun White (Sr. / Memphis, Tenn.)**.

• Senior fullback **Eric Kettani (Kirtland, Ohio)** bulled his way to 75 yards on 22 carries.

• Defensively, the Mids were led by rover **Jeff Deliz (Sr. / Clinton Township, Mich.)** and Tuani, who turned in 10 tackles each. Both players also forced an Air Force fumble. Linebacker **Corey Johnson (Sr. / Anderson, Ind.)** and Pospisil had nine tackles each.

- All-America candidate LeSean McCoy rushed for 156 yards and three touchdowns to lead Pitt to a 42-21 victory over Navy in front of a Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium record crowd of 37,970.
- Navy was held to 251 yards of total offense, including just 194 yards on the ground, while Pitt piled up 499 yards of total offense.
- Pitt took an early 7-0 lead on its first possession of the game as LaRod Stephens-Howling scored from six yards out.
- Navy answered with an impressive drive of its own, marching 63 yards on six plays, capped off by **Shun White's (Sr. / Memphis, Tenn.)** 40-yard touchdown run off an option pitch by senior quarterback **Jarod Bryant (Hoover, Ala.)** to make the score 7-7.
- Pitt matched Navy's scoring drive with the first of McCoy's three touchdowns to make the score 14-7 and then, after Bryant was sacked by Jabaal Sheard and fumbled the ball back to Pitt at the Navy 21-yard line, the Panthers made it 21-7 on a Stephens-Howling nine-yard jaunt.
- Pitt threatened to take a 28-7 lead on its next possession, driving the ball down to the Navy 13-yard line, but on third-and-five senior cornerback **Rashawn King (Raleigh, N.C.)** stepped in front of quarterback Bill Stull's pass at the one-yard line and returned it 91 yards down to the Pitt eight-yard line. It was the third-longest interception return in school history. Bryant scored on the very next play and Navy was back in the game at 21-14.
- After two straight incompletions, Stull hit a wide open T.J. Porter over the middle for a 24-yard completion down to the Navy 25-yard line. Four plays later, McCoy scored on an 11-yard run to make the score 28-14.
- The Panthers put the game away right before the half when McCoy scored on a 58-yard touchdown run to give Pitt a 35-14 lead.
- Both teams scored a meaningless touchdown in the fourth quarter. Pitt went up 42-14 on a 60-yard touchdown pass from Stull to Jonathan Baldwin and Navy got a late touchdown from sophomore quarterback **Ricky Dobbs (Douglasville, Ga.)**.
- Bryant led the Navy offense with 81 yards rushing and a touchdown on 21 carries. White rushed for 70 yards and a touchdown on 10 carries. Wide receiver **Mario Washington (So. / Bowling Springs, N.C.)** caught two passes for 46 yards.
- Outside linebacker **Corey Johnson (Sr. / Anderson, Ind.)** led the defense with 10 tackles, a tackle for a loss, a pass break-up and another tipped pass that nose guard **Nate Frazier (Jr. / Atlanta, Ga.)** intercepted. Linebacker **Ross Pospisil (Jr. / Temple, Texas)** had six tackles and a fumble recovery, marking the fourth-consecutive game he has come up with a turnover for the Mids.

- Third-string quarterback **Ricky Dobbs (So./Douglasville, Ga.)** came off the bench in relief of an injured **Jarod Bryant (Sr./Hoover, Ala.)** and rushed for 224 yards and four touchdowns on 42 carries to lead Navy to a 34-7 rout of SMU at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.
- The game was played in a soaking rain with wind gusts up to 39 miles per hour, but it didn't seem to bother the Midshipmen as they dominated the game on both sides of the ball.
- Navy won despite becoming the first team in the FBS to not attempt a pass in a game since Ohio defeated Akron in 1997.
- The Navy defense held SMU to just three yards of total offense on its first three possessions as the Mids jumped out to a 20-0 first quarter lead.
- Senior slot back **Shun White (Memphis, Tenn.)** became just the eighth Navy player in school history to crack the 2,000-yard barrier on his 23-yard touchdown run to give Navy a 7-0 lead.
- Dobbs entered the game on Navy's next possession after Bryant left the game with a shoulder injury and scored on a two-yard run to make it 13-0. **Matt Harmon (Sr./Greenville, S.C.)**, however, had his streak of made extra-points end at 70 when his try hit the upright.
- On the Mids' third possession of the game, Dobbs pushed Navy's lead to 20-0 on a five-yard run. He capped off the first half scoring on a one-yard run early in the second quarter to give Navy a 27-0 lead at the half.
- Dobbs scored his fourth touchdown with 13:20 left in the game on a seven-yard run to make the final score, 34-7.
- Dobbs' 224 yards rushing are the 12th most in school history and the fourth most by a quarterback. His 42 rushing attempts are tied for the fourth-most in school history.
- Wyatt Middleton (So./Norcross, Ga.)** and **Corey Johnson (Sr./Anderson, Ind.)** led the Navy defense with four tackles each, while senior **Jeff Deliz (Clinton Township, Mich.)** picked off his second-career pass. **Nate Frazier (Jr./Atlanta, Ga.)** and **Matt Nechak (Jr./Canoga Park, Calif.)** each recorded a sack and two tackles for a loss.
- The defense held SMU to -13 yards rushing, which are the fewest rushing yards in a game against Navy since 1978 when Navy held Pitt to -28 yards rushing in a 21-11 Navy victory.
- SMU managed just 144 yards of total offense, which are the fewest yards allowed by Navy since 1997 when the Mids held Army to 87 yards of total offense in a 39-7 rout.

• Linebacker **Clint Sovie's (Jr. / Jacksonville, Fla.)** 42-yard fumble return for a touchdown with 37 seconds left in regulation capped a 20-point rally in the final 9:16 to send the game into overtime and QB **Ricky Dobbs' (So. / Douglasville, Ga.)** one-yard run in overtime gave Navy a miraculous 33-27 overtime victory over Temple.

• It was the largest fourth-quarter comeback in school history and with the win the Mids clinched a berth in the Dec. 20 EagleBank Bowl at RFK Stadium in Washington, D.C.

• Navy trailed 27-7 with 13:41 remaining in the contest when Kee-ayre Griffin scored from 16-yards out. Temple, however, left the door open for a Navy comeback when kicker Jake Brownell, a transfer from Navy, missed the extra-point.

• Dobbs, in relief of starter **Kaipo-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada (Sr. / Kapolei, Hawai'i)**, started the rally with a 22-yard scoring strike to **T.J. Thiel (Sr. / Plymouth, Minn.)** with 9:16 remaining. It was the first career touchdown for Thiel and the first career touchdown pass by Dobbs.

• Navy held Temple on its next possession and Dobbs calmly led the Mids down the field, capping off a nine-play, 64-yard drive with a miraculous pitch on fourth down to fullback **Eric Kettani (Sr. / Kirtland, Ohio)**, who took it in from one-yard out. Dobbs was stacked up at the line by three Temple defenders but was able to pitch the ball to Kettani before being brought to the ground. Senior **Matt Harmon's (Greenville, S.C.)** extra point was blocked leaving the Mids still down seven.

• With two timeouts and 2:52 remaining on the clock, the Mids did not try an onside kick. Unfortunately for Navy, on third-and-five Temple quarterback Adam DiMichele hit Kevin Armstrong with a seven-yard pass on the right sideline giving Temple a first down. After Griffin carried for a loss of two yards on first down, the Mids used their final timeout. On second down, Griffin rushed for one yard and on third down Temple elected to run Griffin one more time. Griffin was stacked up at the line of scrimmage and linebacker **Ross Pospisil (Jr. / Temple, Texas)** knocked the ball out of Griffin's hands and Sovie scooped it up and returned it for a touchdown.

• Navy won the toss and elected to go on defense to begin overtime. Temple chose to play on the end of the field away from the Brigade of the Midshipmen. That plan didn't work when half the Brigade moved to the other end of the stadium and filled the seats around the South End Zone.

• The Owls moved the ball down to the Navy one-yard line, but on third down Griffin was stuffed by Pospisil for no gain and on fourth down Temple tight end Steve Maneri dropped a touchdown pass in the end zone as the Navy defense danced off the field.

• Navy's possession began with a three-yard rush by Kettani followed by three-straight runs by Dobbs and a 15-yard facemask penalty on Temple to position the Mids on the Owls' one-yard line. Dobbs was stopped for no gain on second-and-goal, but scored on the next play to give the Mids the win.

• The cardiac kids almost pulled it off again. Two weeks after pulling off the biggest comeback in school history, Navy nearly pulled off one of the greatest comebacks in NCAA history.

• Trailing 27-7 with 2:30 left in the contest, backup quarterback **Ricky Dobbs (So./Douglasville, Ga.)** led the Mids on a four-play, 57-yard touchdown drive capped off by a 24-yard touchdown run by **Shun White (Sr./Memphis, Tenn.)** with 1:39 left.

• Navy senior kicker **Matt Harmon's (Greenville, S.C.)** onside kick attempt was illegally batted forward, costing the Irish 15 yards and allowing Navy a second onside kick attempt. This time, the kick was perfect and, after sophomore **Travis Simmons (Goldsby, Okla.)** took out the Notre Dame player trying to field the kick, senior **Corey Johnson (Anderson, Ind.)** fell on the ball at the Irish 41-yard line.

• On the first play from scrimmage, Dobbs threw a perfect strike to senior receiver **Tyree Barnes (Hampton, Va.)**, who made a spectacular catch at the Notre Dame one-yard line. Two plays later, Dobbs scored from the one to pull the Mids within a touchdown at 27-20. Harmon made the extra-point and when Notre Dame roughed the kicker, it allowed Navy to kickoff from the 45.

• Once again Harmon's onside kick was perfect, once again Simmons blew up the first line of Notre Dame's hands team and once against Johnson recovered the onside kick at the Irish 41-yard line with 1:21 left.

• After Dobbs ran for seven yards on first down, he threw a pass to a wide-open White at the Notre Dame 11-yard line that he just missed completing.

• Dobbs ran for three yards and a first down on the next play and then Navy intentionally spiked the ball to stop the clock with 39 seconds left.

• Dobbs was sacked on second down, forcing Navy to use its final timeout with 33 seconds left.

• On third down, Dobbs threw a jump ball to Barnes near the goal line that Navy just missed completing and then on fourth down Dobbs' pass sailed over the head of junior slot back **Cory Finnerty (Ventura, Calif.)** to end the game.

• The Mids rushed for just 178 yards on the day with **Eric Kettani (Sr./Kirtland, Ohio)** leading the way with 42 yards. Barnes had two catches for 54 yards.

• The Navy defense forced four Notre Dame turnovers. Senior corner **Ketric Buffin (Rowlett, Texas)** picked off two passes, while **Jabaree Tuani (Fr./Madison, Tenn.)** and **Nate Frazier (Jr./Atlanta, Ga.)** each recovered a fumble, with Frazier recovering the fumble that he forced.

• Senior safety/outside linebacker **Jeff Deliz (Clinton Township, Mich.)** recorded a career-high 17 tackles, while junior linebacker **Ross Pospisil (Temple, Texas)** had 10 tackles and one tackle for a loss.

• Johnson had six tackles, a sack, a forced fumble, a forced interception (his hit on Clausen caused Buffin's second interception) and he recovered two onside kicks.

"He (Welsh) was a genius at calling plays today," said Navy coach Eddie Erdelatz. 

The Mids, however, refused to give up as Candeto directed an 11-play, 79-yard drive to start the second half, capped off by his own two-yard touchdown run on fourth and goal to make it 14-7.

Josh Smith stopped New Mexico's next drive with an interception and the Mids made the Lobos pay dearly, as Polanco hit wide receiver Corey Dryden on the second play from scrimmage with a 61-yard touchdown pass to make the score 21-7.

After the two teams punted on their initial possessions of the third quarter, Polanco ran for his third touchdown of the day, this one from 27 yards out, to make the score 31-19.

New Mexico, however, marched right back down the field. The Lobos had the ball first-and-goal at the Navy six, but on fourth-and-goal from the one Lobo running back D.D. Cox was stopped short of the goal line by Kelley and Bobby McClarin.

The Navy offense would take over the game from there, mounting an epic 26-play, 94-yard, 14:26 drive that was capped off by a Geoff Blumenfeld 22-yard field goal to make the score 34-19. The 26 plays and 14:26 time of possession were both NCAA records for a single drive.

2005 Poinsettia Bowl

Navy 51, Colorado State 30

December 22, 2005

SAN DIEGO, Calif.--Sophomore slot back Reggie Campbell tied an NCAA bowl game record with five touchdowns as he helped lead Navy (8-4) to a 51-30 rout of Colorado State (6-6) in front of 36,842 fans at the inaugural Poinsettia Bowl. The two teams combined for a then NCAA bowl game-record 1,183 yards.

Campbell, who was named the game's offensive MVP, scored on 55- and 34-yard scoring strikes from quarterback Lamar Owens and on runs of 22, two and 21 yards to tie a record set by four others, most notably by Barry Sanders in the 1988 Holiday Bowl.

The Rams jumped out to a 7-0 lead as they marched 77 yards on 10 plays on the opening possession of the game. Kyle Bell capped off the drive with a one-yard touchdown run.

The Mids, however, would answer in just one play as Owens hit Campbell down the middle of the field with a 55-yard touchdown pass to tie the score at seven.

Colorado State would retake the lead on its next possession when Jason Smith kicked a 34-yard field goal with 7:24 remaining in the first half to give the Rams a 10-7 advantage.

Navy took its first lead of the game, a lead it would never give up, early in the second quarter when Marco Nelson scored on a 22-yard run around the right end, capping off a seven-play, 68-yard drive.

After the Navy defense forced a Colorado State punt, the Mids marched 80 yards on 11 plays as Campbell matched Nelson's TD run with a 22-yard touchdown gallop of his own. The Mids defense forced another punt and Campbell capped off an 89-yard drive with a two-yard touchdown run 28 seconds before intermission and the rout was on.

Campbell would score his fourth touchdown of the game on the first possession of the second half on a 21-yard jaunt to give the Mids a 34-10 lead.

The Rams threatened to get back in the game late in the third quarter when quarterback Justin Holland connected with Dustin Osborn on touchdown passes of 10 and 20 yards to make the score 34-24, but Campbell would answer one more time as Owens hit him with a 34-yard touchdown pass on the Mids' next possession.

2006 Meineke Car Care Bowl

Boston College 25, Navy 24

December 30, 2006

CHARLOTTE, N.C.--Steve Aponavicius nailed a 37-yard field goal as time expired to give Boston College (10-3) a 25-24 victory over Navy (9-4) in the Meineke Car Care Bowl.

Navy outplayed the Eagles on both sides of the ball, but a couple of turnovers, two questionable holding calls and a bad bounce allowed the Eagles to escape with the victory.

Boston College jumped out to a 6-0 lead in the first quarter when Eagle quarterback Matt Ryan scored from two yards out.

Navy answered with a 10-play, 88-yard drive capped off by a 31-yard touchdown pass from Kaipo-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada to Tyree Barnes to give a 7-6 lead.

After a Jeremy McGown interception of a Ryan pass gave Navy the ball back at the BC 44-yard line, the Mids took eight plays to take a 14-6 lead on a five-yard touchdown run by Zerbin Singleton. It was Singleton's first-career touchdown.

The Mids tried an on-side kick on the ensuing kick-off, but the ball was kicked too hard and too close to the sideline and the Eagles recovered. Eight plays later, Brian Toal scored from one yard out and BC had cut Navy's lead to 14-13.

Navy answered the Eagles' score with one of its own, going 65 yards on six plays with Kaheaku-Enhada throwing his second touchdown pass of the day, this time on third-and-17 from the BC 24-yard line. Kaheaku-Enhada threw the ball into triple coverage, but Jason Tomlinson made a remarkable juggling catch in the end zone to give Navy a 21-13 lead.

The Navy defense forced a three-and-out on Boston College's next possession and the Mids took the ball over at their own 25 with 4:52 left in the half. Navy quickly moved the ball down to the Boston College 19, but on third-and-one Kaheaku-Enhada threw an incomplete pass to OJ Washington in the end zone and on fourth down Kaheaku-Enhada was stopped just short of the first down.

BC took advantage of Navy's missed opportunity as it sliced up the Mids' defense for 72 yards in 54 seconds with Aponavicius hitting a 26-yard field goal at the gun to cut Navy's lead to five at 21-16 at the half.

Navy regained the momentum to start the second half, going 85 yards on 11 plays. Harmon's 22-yard field goal gave Navy a 24-16 lead.

The Navy defense stepped up again on the Eagles' first drive of the second half as sophomore linebacker Clint Sovie intercepted a Ryan pass at the Navy three-yard line.

After trading punts on two-straight possessions the Mids found themselves pinned deep in BC territory at the six-yard line. On third-and-three from their own 13 the Mids tried to run a reverse to Washington, but he was dumped for a four-yard loss. Junior punter Greg Veteto could manage just a 34-yard punt and after a seven-yard return, the Eagles set up shop at the Navy 36-yard line.

Boston College took advantage of the great field position by moving those 36 yards in just five plays with Ryan throwing a 25-yard touchdown pass on third-and-nine to cut the lead to 24-22.

After both teams traded punts, Navy took the ball over at its own 24 with 4:09 remaining in the game. Boston College had three timeouts remaining so Navy would need a couple of first downs to ice the game. Reggie Campbell and Kaheaku-Enhada got the drive going with runs of six and 16 yards, respectively.

After Eric Kettani was dropped for a two-yard loss on first down, Boston College called its first timeout of the second half. Campbell, however, would pick up another first down on the next play, rushing for 14 yards to the BC 42-yard line. Navy milked the clock down to 2:10 before calling a timeout with one second left on the play clock.

Kettani picked up five yards on first down and forced the Eagles to use their second timeout. On second down Kettani lost one yard to make it third-and-six, but the play forced BC to take its final timeout

with 1:58 remaining. On third-and-six, the Mids ran a toss play to Shun White, who appeared to pick up the first down and clinch the game, but the officials flagged Matt Pritchett for holding. Navy ran its bread and butter play on the next play, the option, but Campbell took his eyes off of Kaheaku-Enhada's pitch and Boston College's Jolon Dunbar picked up the fumble at the Navy 45 and returned it five yards. Six plays later, Aponavicius nailed the 37-yard field goal to give the Eagles the win.

2007 Poinsettia Bowl

Utah 35, Navy 22
December 20, 2007

SAN DIEGO, Calif.--Utah (9-4) outscored Navy (8-5), 21-0, over a seven-minute span at the end of the third quarter and beginning of the fourth quarter to rally for a 35-32 Poinsettia Bowl victory over the Midshipmen in front of 39,129 fans at Qualcomm Stadium in San Diego. The game was the debut for Navy head coach Ken Niumatalolo.

Navy led 10-7 at the half, but should have led by more if it was not for missed opportunities. On the Mids' second drive of the game, which was set up by an interception by linebacker Ross Pospisil, Reggie Campbell fumbled on the Utah two-yard line and the ball was recovered by the Utes' Joe Giannoni.

Utah would take a 7-0 lead early in the second quarter on a five-yard touchdown run by Darrell Mack. The Utes started their scoring drive on their own 33 after Navy kicker Joey Bullen missed a 50-yard field goal.

The Mids would answer Utah's score with one of their own, driving 70 yards in eight plays. The key play on the drive was a 19-yard run by Shun White. Junior quarterback Kaipo-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada capped the drive with a one-yard touchdown run to tie the score at seven.

After the Navy defense forced Utah to go three-and-out on its next possession, the Mids took the ball over at their own 47 with 2:39 left in the half and methodically drove 31 yards in 11 plays with Bullen capping the drive with a 39-yard field goal with 28 seconds left on the clock to give Navy a 10-7 halftime lead.

Navy made it 17-7 on the first drive of the third quarter, moving 69 yards on four running plays. White's 15-yard run put the ball at the Utah 43 and then junior fullback Eric Kettani busted through the Utah secondary and rumbled 43 yards for a touchdown to give Navy a 17-7 lead.

Navy really had a chance to put the game away on the following possession as the defense rose to the challenge once again and forced Utah to punt after just four plays. However, the punt by Utah All-American Louie Sakoda pinned Navy back at its own eight-yard line.

The Mids were unable to pick up a first down as Kaheaku-Enhada was held to two yards on a third-and-five run and Utah got the ball back on its own 41 after a punt by senior Greg Veteto.

The Utes quickly moved down the field as quarterback Brian Johnson completed three straight passes and then, after a rush by Johnson and two runs by Mack, wide receiver Jerome Brooks scored from 23 yards out off a reverse to cut Navy's lead to 17-14.

Utah took the lead on its next drive, easily moving the ball 84 yards on just five plays. Four of the plays were passes, the last a 40-yard touchdown strike from Johnson to Derrek Richards to make the score 21-17.

Utah forced a third-consecutive Navy punt on its next drive and the Utes took advantage by scoring a third-straight touchdown. Johnson's 19-yard quarterback draw gave Utah a 28-17 lead with 12:47 left in the contest.

To Navy's credit, the Mids refused to quit as Kaheaku-Enhada led Navy on a nine-play, 81-yard drive that was capped off by a 10-yard touchdown pass to White that made the score 28-25.

The Utes took the ensuing kickoff and drove right back down the field where it looked like they would score again, but on third-and-goal from the four, Johnson hit Brooks with a swing pass and Navy's Ketric Buffin knocked the ball out of Brooks' hands as he headed for the end zone. The fumble clearly hit the pylon, which should have given the ball to Navy at the 20-yard line. Unfortunately, the officials missed the ball hitting the pylon and inexplicably the replay official did not overturn the call. After the game, the Mid-American Conference officials and replay official apologized to Navy for blowing the call. The Mids did hold Utah on

fourth down as Rashawn King and a host of other Midshipmen stopped Mack on the one-yard line on fourth down.

Still, Navy had to take the ball over at its own one-yard line instead of at the 20, which limited the play-calling. After picking up eight yards on the first three plays, the Mids went for it on fourth-and-two from their own nine and Utah's Joe Dale made a great play to stop Kaheaku-Enhada a yard short of the first down. The Utah offense would score three plays later on a Mack one-yard run and the Utes appeared to have an insurmountable 35-25 lead with 1:27 left.

The Mids, however, had other ideas. After Kaheaku-Enhada hit Zerbin Singleton with a six-yard pass on third-and-six that gave Navy a first down on its own 42, Kaheaku-Enhada went back to Singleton on the very next play for a 58-yard touchdown pass that made the score 35-32 with 57 seconds left.

Bullen then pulled off a perfectly-executed on-side kick that initially Utah's Dale had his hands on, but Singleton ripped it out of his hands giving the ball to Navy at its own 42 with 57 seconds left. After Kaheaku-Enhada ran for nine yards on first down, his pass was intercepted by Dale at the Utah 31 after Campbell slipped coming out of his route.

PHILADELPHIA - Just before leaving the locker room to run onto Lincoln Financial Field to face archrival Army, Navy safety Jeff Deliz sent a text message to fellow senior and close friend Rashawn King.

"This game is for you. Just stay strong," Deliz wrote.

King was not in Philadelphia yesterday. The cornerback who had started Navy's previous 11 games this season was home in Raleigh, N.C., with close family following the unexpected death of his father.

Maj. Drexel King died suddenly on Thursday night after suffering a heart attack. The man who was known so well to so many Navy football players was only 48 years old.

"Drexel King was a father figure to many of the players on this team. There were a lot of guys who knew him intimately," Navy head coach Ken Niumatalolo said. "This is a private time for Rashawn and his family. We're just here to show support in any way we can. We wanted to rally around Rashawn and hopefully get this win for him."

Rashawn King found out about his father's death upon arriving at the team hotel in Philadelphia late Thursday night. He flew back to Raleigh first thing Friday morning to grieve along with his mother, sister and other relatives.

Deliz, who was King's roommate on the road throughout the season, was left speechless after hearing the news.

"After we got off the bus on Thursday night, I didn't see Rashawn for about an hour. We finally got to the room and I started joking around like usual and I could tell something was wrong, that Rashawn was real down," said Deliz, who was pulled aside and informed of the tragedy by Ketric Buffin, another senior defensive back and close friend of King's. "I went into total shock. I almost felt like a part of me was lost. Mr. King was almost like a second father. It felt like I'd known him forever. He gave me a big hug every time I saw him. He always encouraged me no matter how good or bad I played."

Army-Navy is the biggest game of the year for both sides. The annual battle against the archrival is particularly important to the

seniors, whose football careers are coming to a close with a life in the military looming.

However, what happened to Drexel King was a reminder that football, even Army-Navy football, is just a game. Rashawn King did not think twice about skipping the last Army-Navy game of his career. Teammates and coaches knew from the moment they heard the news that the hard-hitting cornerback, who has started 31 games and recorded 158 tackles during his career, would not be playing.

"It's the biggest game of the year and I'm sure Rashawn was looking forward to it a lot," Deliz said. "We definitely talked about dedicating this game to Rashawn. We played for him, we played for our brother."

Thanks to an extraordinary effort by helmet manufacturer Riddell and the Navy equipment staff, every Midshipman sported a sticker in memory of Drexel King. The helmet decal design was a black crown with the initials DK inside.

Junior Darius Terry started at cornerback in place of King and played well, recording five tackles to help the defense post its first shutout of Army since 1978. Defensive coordinator Buddy Green, who recruited King and served as his position coach, was proud of how the unit performed in the absence of a starter and key leader.

"Rashawn is going through something tough. Drexel King and he were close, they are a very close family. Rashawn went home to take care of his mom and sister. It is where he needs to be," Green said. "Rashawn is a great young man and a leader for a lot of our younger guys. Drexel was close to a lot of guys on our team. He was at all our home games and never missed a road game. The family was totally all-in for Navy football."

It was Drexel King, a career Army officer, who suggested his son and namesake consider attending a service academy. While his father initially was hoping for West Point, Rashawn King wound up in Annapolis because he thought the Naval Academy was a better fit.

Despite a life devoted to the Army, Drexel King quickly became a diehard Navy fan. He hosted huge tailgate parties in the Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium parking lot for every home game. On Senior Day, Drexel and wife Robbin put together a huge post-game dinner for the entire team.

"Mr. King was just an awesome guy. He always had a huge smile

on his face and was friendly to everybody," said Navy graduate assistant Matt Wimsatt, a former linebacker who attended Ravenscroft High in Raleigh along with Rashawn King.

"My lasting memory of Mr. King will be coming out of the locker room and seeing him there with that big smile. Win or lose, he was always there to greet you and say good game. He loved Navy football and he was very proud of his son."

Deliz had a heart-to-heart talk with Rashawn King early Friday morning before he left for the airport. Words were difficult, after all, what does someone say to a teammate who just lost a parent that was far too young and full of life to leave this world?

"I just told him to stay strong and to trust that God will help him out," Deliz said. "I know this is going to be a rough road for a while. My prayers go out to Rashawn. It's just terrible and I feel so bad for him."

Slot back triggers Whitewash

PHILADELPHIA - Wherever Shun White went, his teammates followed.

White scored a pair of early touchdowns to lead the charge in Navy's 34-0 win over Army all while shattering personal marks and putting himself alone in the Navy record books.

"I know if I get the ball, I can make a play," said White, who finished the regular season with 1,021 rushing yards and nine total touchdowns.

White led the Midshipmen (8-4) with 148 rushing yards, single-handedly outgaining Army's ninth-ranked ground attack, while winning the Philadelphia Sports Congress MVP award. The Black Knights (3-9), entering play averaging 254.1 yards a game, totaled just 118 yards.

White had 120 yards before halftime.

"If everyone executes their assignments, I don't think the offense can be stopped," White said. "I think today was a good showing of that."

White took a pitch on Navy's third play from scrimmage and made a 65-yard dash down the right sideline lead early in the first quarter, and he brought down an 18-yard pass in the second for a 17-0 lead.

Kaipo-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada, making his first start since Nov. 1 against Temple, hit White at the perfect moment on third-and-2 from the Navy 35. White picked up a key block from Bobby Doyle and sprinted downfield, eluding a diving defender at the 15, en route to his fourth touchdown of 65 or more yards this season and a 7-0 lead.

"There's so much into it. When you come as a plebe ... the first day you come here it's 'Go, Navy; beat Army,'" Midshipmen coach Ken Niumatalolo said. "You're so tight. I think that play just helped us settle down."

Navy padded its lead to 17-0 when Kaheaku-Enhada found White wide open on a crossing pattern in the middle of the field during the second quarter. White broke to the left before stepping back for the pass. Untouched, he took the ball 18 yards into the right corner.

With an 11-yard run on a draw play early in the third quarter, White became the first slot back in Navy history to eclipse the 1,000-yard plateau. Reggie Campbell held the previous mark with 706 yards in 2006.

White move past Adam Ballard for seventh all-time in rushing yards with his 65-yard touchdown run, and he pushed his total to 2,240 for pass Alton Grizzard for sixth. Ballard, who never ran for more than 792 yards, finished a three-year career with 2,125, while Grizzard notched 2,174.

Not since Kyle Eckel in 2005 has a Navy running back ran for more than 1,000 yards. Eckel, who ran for 27 yards with the Philadelphia Eagles last week, amassed 1,147 yards and 11 touchdowns as a senior.

White, who didn't become a top option until this season, nearly matched his three-year output as a Midshipman during his senior year. He came into this season with 1,219 yards and 12 touchdowns on the ground.

"If he touches the ball, he better score," Kaheaku-Enhada said. "If everybody does their jobs, there's no reason why he shouldn't."

White began his final year wearing blue and gold by setting a single-game, school record with 348 rushing yards in a 41-13 victory against Towson. He ran for three touchdowns against the Tigers and posted two scores in a Week 3 loss to Duke.

White waited almost two months - and until Navy's biggest game of the season - before crossing the goal line twice to cap a memorable regular season.

"I wouldn't want to end it no other way," White said. "This season, for me, has been a great season. From my offensive line, my coaches and the other slot backs: Give a lot of credit to those guys because without their blocking, I wouldn't be able to make plays."

Navy overwhelms Army for 7th win in row over rival

PHILADELPHIA - Army entered yesterday's annual showdown against archrival Navy with new-found confidence. Buoyed by a switch to an option offense and defined by a hard-hitting defense, the Black Knights were vastly improved this season.

With three victories and three losses by nine points or less, Army was within reach of its first winning season since 1996. Perhaps more importantly, the Black Knights were certain they had closed the gap on the Midshipmen, who have set the standard for service academy football since 2003.

"I think that we'll be competitive and I believe we have the opportunity to win the game. Our players believe that we have a good chance to win the game," Army head coach Stan Brock said last week.

All of which explains why yesterday's lopsided loss to Navy had to be an absolutely crushing blow for Army. It turns out the Black Knights are still a long way from being able to beat the Midshipmen.

Slot back Shun White rushed for 148 yards and a touchdown while nose guard Nate Frazier anchored a dominating defensive effort as Navy shut out Army 34-0 yesterday in front of 69,144 at Lincoln Financial Field. The Midshipmen have won seven straight meetings with the Black Knights, the longest streak in the 109-year history of the series.

"I couldn't be more proud of our seniors. To play our rivals and shut them out, play the way we did in the most important game of the year and get a convincing win... it's a great tribute to the seniors," Navy head coach Ken Niumatalolo said. "For four years they have given everything they could for the program and this is a great way for them to go out."

Navy, which won three of its last four to conclude the regular sea-

son with an 8-4 record, also captured the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy for the seventh consecutive year. The Midshipmen have won 13 straight service academy games, breaking the previous record set by Air Force from 1997-2002.

"It means a lot, especially for the guys that came before. Coming in, you don't want to be the senior class that drops the ball," White said of the extending the winning streak against Army and keeping the Commander-in-Chief's Trophy in Annapolis.

White set the tone early, taking an option pitch and breaking a 65-yard touchdown run on Navy's third play from scrimmage. The standout senior got a great block from fellow slot back Bobby Doyle then showed his sprinter's speed in out-racing several defenders down the sideline to put the Mids ahead 7-0 less than three minutes into the game.

"I think it was a very important play because it got the offense going and from there on out it was a steamroll," said White, who became the first slot back in Navy history to surpass the 1,000-yard plateau.

Fullback Eric Kettani rumbled up the middle for 125 yards and a touchdown on 24 carries for Navy, which took a 17-0 lead into half-time and never looked back. The Midshipmen out-gained the Black Knights, 430 total yards to 154.

Navy got a big lift offensively from quarterback Kaipō-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada, who played for the first time in a month and lasted for the entire game for only the second time this season. Kaheaku-Enhada, who has been bothered all season by a hamstring injury, started and did a terrific job directing the triple-option offense in terms of reading the defense and distributing the ball.

"Kaipo did a great job. There's an experience factor that Kaipo brings that you can't coach. He's been in big games," Niumatalolo said.

Kaheaku-Enhada, who was making his fifth start of the season, threw an 18-yard touchdown pass to White. He set up one of two

Matt Harmon field goals with a 34-yard completion to wide receiver Tyree Barnes. The Hawaii native also rushed for 43 yards on 14 carries.

"That experience Kaipō brings is big. He knows what checks to make, he knows how to read the defense the best," White said. "I think he's the best fit to run this offense."

Frazier was the key to shutting down Army's newly-installed option, which primarily features fullback Collin Mooney and quarterback Chip Bowden. Frazier manhandled Army center Trey Miranne and was in the backfield all day. The 6-foot-3, 287-pound junior recorded six solo tackles and repeatedly disrupted the fullback dive.

"Nate really stepped up and that's where it starts in terms of stopping the belly option. It all starts up front and Nate got some movement and that gave us a chance to have a good day," Navy defensive coordinator Buddy Green said.

Mooney needed 54 yards to set the single-season school rushing record and got exactly that. The bruising 5-foot-10, 247-pound senior averaged just 3.2 yards on his 17 carries. Meanwhile, Bowden was limited to a mere six yards on 14 carries as Army converted on just 4 of 17 third and fourth down opportunities.

"I said earlier in the week that it would come down to who executes better, and their defense executed better than our offense," Mooney said.

Inside linebacker led Navy with 12 tackles and was another key figure in stuffing Mooney. Outside linebacker Ram Vela had seven tackles and a sack then clinched the rout by intercepting a pass and returning it 68 yards for a touchdown.

"You have to give Navy credit. They played a heck of a football game. I think, defensively, they played as well as anyone we played this year," Brock said. "I think their coaching staff deserves a lot of credit along with their players."

Navy has now beaten Army by an average of 29 points over the

last seven years. Brock said yesterday's game would serve as a measuring stick for how far the Black Knights have truly come this season and was not pleased with the answer.

"I am disappointed in the way we executed, the way that we played and the way I got them ready," Brock said. "When you lose like that, everyone has to look at themselves, myself included. I am very disappointed for the seniors and our captains. I think they earned and deserved better than going out like that."

Guard needs speed as much as Navy needs him

Anthony Gaskins' passionate interest in drag racing has been well-documented. Navy's starting left guard has been an ardent follower of the National Hot Rod Racing Association ever since being introduced to the sport by his great-grandfather.

What has not been well-publicized is the fact Gaskins has taken his need for speed to the street. The 6-foot-1, 284-pound senior is the proud owner of a flashy Ford Lightning, a sports-performance version of the F-150 pickup truck. Released and marketed by the company's Special Vehicle Team, the Ford Lightning is touted as combining outstanding handling with spirited acceleration. It is powered by a modular two-valve "Triton" engine that can produce 360 horsepower.

Gaskins sheepishly admits that his Ford Lightning has undergone some "after-market" alterations. In other words, the truck has been suped-up for speed. "I like fast cars. I wanted to get something that could really go," he said.

"Anthony tries to tell me all the time what type of engine modifications have been made to his truck, but I have no idea what he's talking about," said fellow offensive lineman and close friend Sander Gossard. "I do know that it's all gadgeted-up. He's got every gizmo you could think of."

Gaskins won't reveal how fast he's driven the truck on the open road, but one drag racing Web site reported that a tricked-out Ford Lightning has a maximum speed of 189 miles per hour.

"It's definitely real fast. Anthony has put a lot of work into it. When he starts it up, it makes a weird noise," Navy wide receiver Tyree Barnes said.

Barnes, who has been best friends with Gaskins ever since they roomed together at the Naval Academy Prep School, refuses to ride in the truck anymore after enduring a bad experience.

"The first time Tyree rode in it, I scared him a little bit. I hit the gas and did a burnout. He's been a little nervous ever since," Gaskins said with a chuckle.

Gaskins, a native of West Orange, N.J., grew up attending NHRA weekend events at nearby Old Bridge Township Raceway Park. He would routinely accompany his great-grandfather, grandfather and others relatives on trips to major events up and down the East Coast.

Upon graduation from St. Peter's Prep, Gaskins received a strange gift from his great-grandfather and mother. Charles Johnson and Charlene Gaskins sent the youngster to Frank Hawley's Drag Racing Camp in Gainesville, Fla. Gaskins earned a license to drive Super Comp Dragsters after completing six rounds, recording a top time of 8.53 seconds at 163 miles per hour.

Gaskins showed off his driving skills by winning the 2007 Poinsettia Bowl Go-Kart Racing Grand Prix. Gaskins deftly avoided multiple attempts by teammates to spin him out or run him into the wall then easily out-sprinted quarterback Kaipō-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada down the stretch.

While Gaskins may play it fast and loose on the track, he is all about consistency and precision on the field. A two-year starter at left guard, Gaskins has become a master of executing the various blocks necessary in Navy's triple-option offense.

"Anthony might be the best guard that I've coached since I've been here," said Navy head coach Ken Niumatalolo, who oversaw the offensive line the previous six seasons. "Anthony has all the intangibles. He's strong enough to base block and fast enough to pull. He's real smart, real tough, very athletic and very explosive."

Niumatalolo is most impressed with Gaskins' football intelligence, which he says are "second-to-none" among offensive linemen at Navy during the current triple-option era.

"Anthony has the ability to make split-second decisions because

he sees what is happening so quickly," Niumatalolo said. "He's been a guy over the last two years who has come off the field and told me what was going on."

Gaskins is the unquestioned leader of an inexperienced offensive line that features four first-year starters. He has taken on the responsibility of teaching the others the intricacies of cut blocking and taking the proper angles.

"Coach Niumat told me after the bowl game last year that no one was coming back on offensive line and that I would have to be the one to lead them," Gaskins said. "I try to help the younger guys with the little nuances of understanding what the defense is doing. I tell them that if the linemen slant this way, this is probably what's going to happen."

Gaskins was probably headed to Division I-AA Lehigh or Lafayette before Navy assistant Dale Pehrson stopped by St. Peter's Prep and suggested he take an official visit to Annapolis. Intrigued by the quality of education and impressed by the remarkable bond between the players, the baby-faced youngster decided to take the plunge.

"The military side of things was not something I really wanted to do and I was still a little hesitant during that year at prep school," said Gaskins, who has selected surface warfare as a service assignment and hopes to be stationed in Norfolk, Va.

"But that's where I met guys like Tyree and Sander and Shun White. You really bond together and that's what keeps you here and gets you through the place. The brotherhood at the academy is unbelievable. I've made s many friends that I will have forever. There is something special you develop here as part of this football team."

Gaskins is nursing a sprained ankle suffered late in the Northern Illinois game, but said there is no way he will miss appearing in a fourth straight Army-Navy game. Gossard, a fellow New Jersey native who got to know Gaskins well during drives home together from prep school and during plebe year, is not surprised his friend

has become such a standout performer.

"I know the day-to-day Anthony. I see him put in the work in the weight room, in the film room and on the practice field. Based on that, I knew he would wind up becoming a starter and doing well," Gossard said. "Anthony has a real good understanding of the offense and is always doing what he's supposed to do, being where he's supposed to be. He's a physical player who really gets after it."

Navy QB is making a run at redemption

It's not that things always went perfectly for Kaipo-Noa Kaheaku-Enhada during his first three seasons playing football at Navy.

During spring practice when Kaheaku-Enhada was a sophomore, then-Navy coach Paul Johnson gave him a week to prove he could play quarterback in the same triple-option offense he'd run in high school in Hawaii.

In two seasons as a starter, Kaheaku-Enhada played two of his worst games against Army.

But nothing prepared Kaheaku-Enhada for what he encountered this season after tearing his hamstring during an August scrimmage and struggling to get back onto the field consistently since.

"It's definitely a growing experience," he said. "In life, you're going to hit adversity, and you've just got to work through it. I had to work back from being really low. You go from really low to really high, and this year I was really low."

Kaheaku-Enhada said the lowest point came when he returned for a second time after reinjuring the hamstring against Wake Forest.

"Running the ball a little bit, and just realizing that you're not the same person you were before," said Kaheaku-Enhada, who came out in the third quarter against Temple. "Feeling myself running the way I did put things into perspective."

Which is why Saturday's game against Army at Lincoln Financial Field in Philadelphia is so important to Kaheaku-Enhada, who is expected to play for the first time in more than a month and could start.

"It means a lot to me; it's an opportunity I have to take," he said. "The fact that I get to play against Army again. I have two games

left. Hopefully I'll make it out of this game, just make it to it for that matter. I'll be grateful for it, just the opportunity to play."

It will also be a chance for improvement. In two starts against Army, both victories, Kaheaku-Enhada has been held in check, completing three of 11 passes for 18 yards and rushing 29 times for 91 yards, including 14 carries for 27 yards a year ago.

Still, even with this season's disappointment, Kaheaku-Enhada will finish his career with his name all over the Navy record book, including possibly as the school's career leader in yards per play, where he entered the season a fraction ahead of Lamar Owens.

"I think I reached expectations, coming out of high school, I wanted to be a star," Kaheaku-Enhada said. "Freshman year really put things in perspective. You sit back and see that everybody in college is just as good or better than you. At this point in my career, I've done a lot. I've come a long way."

Said Navy coach Ken Niumatalolo, who as a fellow Hawaiian was instrumental in recruiting Kaheaku-Enhada: "He's helped turn some of our program around. He's been part of us winning a lot of games. In the era since Coach Johnson came, I don't think anyone has started more games" at quarterback.

It took a challenge from his former coach to set his career path as a Navy quarterback.

"Coach Johnson said, 'You've got one week to prove yourself,'" Kaheaku-Enhada recalled. "I stuck around for a week and a day. I thought maybe this thing is going to work out. Things started to break a little for me at quarterback. ... I was surprised he kept me there through the spring."

By the start of his senior year, Kaheaku-Enhada was being mentioned among the candidates for the Davey O'Brien Award, given annually to the nation's top college quarterback. Less than two weeks later, his candidacy was over when he tore his hamstring.

After the team started the season 1-1, Kaheaku-Enhada came

back against Duke on Sept.13.

"I wasn't in shape at Duke. My legs got tired out there, and I couldn't move them anymore," said Kaheaku-Enhada, whose toughness was questioned when he took himself out at halftime of the Midshipmen's 41-31 loss.

He understands now how important it is for him to come back again, this week, against Army.

"I don't think it's as important to me as it is to the team," he said. "I think I do give the team a chance. If I don't work my hardest and give the team my all, I'm nothing for the team. And that's what we are. We're brothers. That's what it comes down to. You've got the man next to you who's going to be sitting in that hole with you, shooting a gun. That's all we got."

Navy quarterback connects with NFL trailblazer

Jan. 31, 1988. That is the day Doug Williams led the Washington Redskins to a 42-10 rout of the Denver Broncos in Super Bowl XXII. It's also the day Ricky Dobbs was born.

When Dobbs was told of that connection as a young boy, he learned more about Williams and decided he wanted to follow in his footsteps by becoming a National Football League quarterback.

"Once I found out that I was born on the same day Doug Williams won the Super Bowl I decided he would be a good person to look up to and that I would try to accomplish the same things he did," Dobbs said.

Dobbs got the thrill of his lifetime last Friday when Williams called out of the blue to wish the young quarterback good luck in his first career start for the Navy football team.

"I never thought I would get to talk with Doug Williams. It's a blessing that we are connected and it was a dream come true to get to know him a little bit," Dobbs said.

"That practically made my entire football career. That's one of my goals checked off the list."

Williams enjoyed a nine-year career in the NFL with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers and Washington Redskins. The Louisiana native reached the pinnacle of the sport that January night when he was named Most Valuable Player after setting or tying several Super Bowl records, including most touchdown passes (4), most passing yards (340), and longest touchdown pass (80 yards).

What made that day truly historical and memorable was the fact Williams became the first African-American quarterback to start and win a Super Bowl.

Down in tiny Douglasville, Ga., Barbara Cobb went into labor just as the 1988 Super Bowl was getting underway. Clarence Dobbs was attending a Super Bowl party when he got the word and was able to see Williams make history before heading to the hospital to watch as Ricky was born at 8:22 p.m.

Ricky Dobbs was about five years old when he went shopping with his mother and took a liking to a burgundy-and-gold football jersey

bearing the number No. 17. Barbara Cobb explained that it was the Washington Redskins jersey of Doug Williams and told her son that he had a special connection with the man.

Navy sports information director Scott Strasmeier had heard the story and decided to pass it along to Williams, who is now an executive with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers. Strasmeier got to know Williams while the latter served as running backs coach at Navy in 1994.

Williams was honored to find out he was the idol of a current Navy quarterback and was amazed the youngster was born on the same day he won the Super Bowl. Williams decided to call Dobbs and get to know the Georgia native a little better.

"We had a really good conversation. We talked about everything from football to life at the academy," Dobbs said. "He was happy to find out I would be starting and told me to just go out there and play loose, play my game."

Williams was proud that he inspired Dobbs to play quarterback and said he should be equally motivated by the recent presidential election. It struck Williams that Barack Obama become the first African-American president in United States history 20 years after that historic Super Bowl.

"Back in 1988 people thought it was a big deal that a black man could lead a team to victory in the Super Bowl. That's nothing compared to a black man making it to the White House," Williams said. "My message to Ricky and all young black males is that there is no excuse anymore. You can accomplish anything if you set your mind to it."

Dobbs certainly has his future mapped out, telling Williams of his plans to graduate from the Naval Academy, serve in the military, play in the NFL and win a Super Bowl then go into politics and become president by the year 2040.

"I was very impressed to hear about Ricky's goals and ambitions. Ricky knows what he wants in life and it sure seems like he has the confidence to achieve those dreams," Williams said.

Williams gave Dobbs his cell phone number and told the youngster to call the next time he was in the Tampa area. Williams said he would be watching ESPN Classic tonight when Dobbs leads Navy against Northern Illinois.

"Hopefully, Ricky and I can sit down one day for lunch and really

get to know each other," Williams said. "It was very uplifting for me to hear Ricky's story. It's not often that a young man spells out what you have meant to him. I'll be following Ricky Dobbs closely from here on out."

Mid blossoms after jumping from basketball to football

Ask any Navy football coach about Corey Johnson and they will express regret that the talented outside linebacker spent just two years in the program.

"I wish Corey had one more year. He is just now coming into his own," head coach Ken Niumatalolo said.

Defensive coordinator Buddy Green, who has watched Johnson become an integral part of his unit, echoed those words.

"I wish I had Corey for two more years. I would love to see what type of player he would be two years from now," Green said.

Johnson is a fifth-year senior who will graduate next month. However, the 6-foot-2, 205-pound outside linebacker is the equivalent of a sophomore on the football team. That's because the Indiana native joined the program in 2007 after spending three seasons playing varsity basketball at the Naval Academy.

Johnson was a pretty good basketball player, a three-year starter at point guard whose 139 career steals ranks sixth all-time in Navy history. He was a Patriot League All-Rookie selection as a freshman and ranked second or third on the team in rebounding, assists and steals as a sophomore.

However, following an admittedly mediocre junior campaign, Johnson realized his desire and enthusiasm for basketball were waning. A two-time All-State selection in football at Highland High, Johnson missed the gridiron sport and wondered whether he was good enough to play at the collegiate level.

In a move that surprised many, Johnson announced he was quitting basketball and joining the football program. It didn't seem to make much sense since he only had one year to re-acclimate to football and attempt to earn a spot on the depth chart.

Johnson, who began practicing with the football team during the spring of 2007, primarily played on special teams last season. He was switched from defensive back to outside linebacker toward the end of the campaign and saw spot duty in a reserve role.

Johnson has blossomed into an impact player. He ranks third on the team with 68 total tackles while wreaking havoc from the hybrid position known as "Raider."

Johnson has assumed the unique role previously held by such standouts as David Mahoney and Tyler Tidwell. By switching back-and-forth between linebacker and rush end, Johnson enables Navy to switch defensive fronts without changing personnel.

"That's a very important position because it allows us to change from an odd to an even front. When a player gets the hang of it like Corey has, it really increases what you can do defensively because you can use him in a lot of ways," Green explained.

Johnson ranks third on the team in tackles for loss (6.5) while also recording two sacks and two forced fumbles.

Johnson was supposed to graduate last May, but was extended academically. He still had eligibility in football after playing just one season.

Johnson spent the summer at the academy absorbing himself in football. He hit the weight room hard, participated in seven-on-seven passing drills and watching hours of film.

"Last year, I had no idea what I was doing. I realized it wasn't enough to just rely on my athleticism," Johnson said. "I spent the off-season hanging around the football building, asking a lot of questions and trying to get back into that football mentality."

Green compares Johnson to another two-sport athlete he developed while head coach at Tennessee-Chattanooga. Terrell Owens was primarily a basketball player before giving up the hardwood as a senior and focusing on football. The Dallas Cowboys wide receiver has enjoyed a 12-year career in the National Football League and is a six-time Pro Bowl selection.

"Corey, like Terrell, committed to the weight room and got so much physically stronger," Green said. "Corey has really increased his lower body strength and thus plays with more power. He is a tougher, more physical and effective tackler as a result of that increased strength."

Simply getting repetitions and playing games has helped Johnson regain a feel for the game.

"The biggest difference between this year and last year is the instincts are coming back. I'm able to read the offense better, see things quicker and trust my instincts more," Johnson said. "It's kind of like the feeling I used to have on the basketball court. You see things develop and you don't even think... you just automatically react. Football is starting to become second nature again."

Green switched Johnson from the "Striker" linebacker position to the "Raider" three games into the season and the player said that is when things began to click. He registered a team-high nine tackles in his "Raider" debut against Duke and has made rapid improvement ever since.

Green said Johnson understands his role in the defensive system and agreed he gets better with each passing game. He marvels at how far the former basketball player has come in less than two seasons.

Johnson recorded six solo tackles and a sack last Saturday against Notre Dame. He forced quarterback Jimmy Clausen into a pair of turnovers, jarring the ball loose on the sack for a fumble and causing an interception with a pressure.

"Being from Indiana, it was a dream come true to play well against Notre Dame," said Johnson, who capped the tremendous effort by recovering back-to-back onside kicks to give Navy a chance to rally.

Considering how far he has come in two seasons, Johnson does sometimes wonder what would have happened had he played football all four years at Navy. However, those thoughts are tempered by the fact he thoroughly enjoyed the experience of playing college basketball for three years.

"Growing up, I dreamed of playing college football and basketball. I've been fortunate to be able to live that dream for both sports," Johnson said. "It's been a blessing to be part of two teams at this level. A lot of the lessons I learned on the basketball court, the maturity, leadership and experience I gained, have transferred to football."
